CANDIES FOR CHRISTMAS.
Home-made Kind the Best and Cheapest.

Confectionery always forms a large
part of the Christmas outlay, especially
where there are children, and the num-
ber who make their Christmas candies
increases every year. This is more
economical, and it also ensures purity of
the product.

In making any candy the body of
which has for a foundation a sugar syr-
up, stirring with a spoon is apt to spoil
the fine grain. Take a medium-sized
glass agate and place it at the bottom of
the pan. The boiling of the syrup will
keep the mixture from sticking on or
burning, and there is no danger of the
coarse and sugary candy that a spoon
will cause.

Makers of Fudge will, a correspondent
of Good Housekeeping says, get better
results by boiling the fudge twice. Af-
ter it has boiled and thoroughly cooled
add about two tablespoonfuls of milk
and return it to the fire to boil a second
time. Let it cool again, then beat well.
Besides improving the flavor, this meth-
od will make the candy much more
creamy and smooth.

Fruit Fudge.
Boil three cupfuls of granulated sugar
three teaspoonfuls of cocoa, three-quar-
ters of a cupful of milk and one table-
spoonful of butter. When it will form
a soft ball in cold water, add one-half
cupful each of chopped raisins and nuts,
one-quarter of a cupful of coconut and
three-quarters of a cupful of figs, cut in
small pieces. Pour into a buttered pan
and when partly cool mark into squares.

Cherry Foams.
Boil two cupfuls of granulated sugar,
and one-half cupful of water without
stirring until the syrup will thread. Add
one-quarter teaspoonful of vanilla and
pour it slowly upon the beaten whites of
two eggs, beating continuously until
still enough to drop from a teaspoon up-
on butter paper. Before the candies
cool, press one half of a candied cherry
into the top of each. If preferred beat
cherries into the candy and when creamy
pour it into buttered pans.

Coffee Fudge
Boil together two cupfuls of granulated
sugar and one cupful of strong coffee.,
with one tablespoonful of butter or one
tablespoonful of rich cream, and a speck
of salt, until it forms a thread. Re-
move from the fire and beat until smooth
and creamy. Pour into a buttered pan
and make into squares when partly cool.

Nut-and-Raisin Dainty.
Dissolve three cupfuls of granulated
sugar in one cupful of milk, and let the
mixture come to a boil. Add a piece of
butter the size of a small egg, and cook
with as little stirring as possible, until
the syrup ropes when dropped from a
knife or a spoon. When it reaches that
point remove it from the fire, and stir
in one teaspoonful of vanilla extract and
half a cupful each of chopped nut meats
and stoned raisins. Stir the mixture
until it begins to thicken, then pour it
immediately into a buttered pan.
When it is cold, cut it into squares.
The secret of success in making this
candy is to measure the ingredients
carefully, to avoid stirring the mixture
while it is cooking, and to stop the
cooking as soon as you have added the
nuts and the raisins.

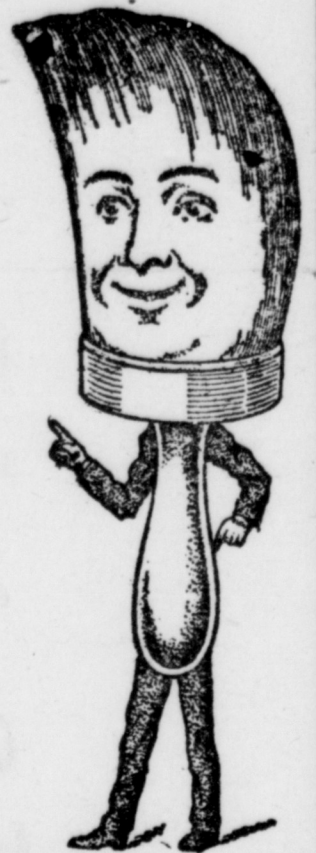
