Household Hints

**BOIL YOUNG TURNIPS WITH-
OUT PEELING.**

While turnips are young and
fresh, wash and boil without peel-
ing, and the thick rind will be as
tender as any other part of the
vegetable, while the flavor will
be improved. When they are
older, they may be skinned just like beets, or
or scalded to remove the rind.

BAKED RICE AND CHEESE.

Two-thirds cup rice cooked in
two cups boiling water. Cook
until tender. Make a white sauce
of one cup milk, two tablespoons
of flour, two tablespoons of
butter, one-half teaspoon salt, pinch
pepper, one-fourth pound cheese
grated. To this mixture add some
ground cold beef, the top covered
butter crumbs. Bake one-half
hour.

BEEF LOAF.

One and a half pounds round
steak, one-fourth pound fat pork,
two tablespoons milk or cream,
one tablespoon lemon juice, three
tablespoons bread crumbs, one egg,
three fourths tablespoon salt and
a good sprinkling of pepper.
Make into loaf and bake 1 1/2 hours.

DON'TS FOR THE KITCHEN

Don't throw away the small ends of
candles. They are excellent to add to
boiled starch; or shaved, they will wax
a floor.

Don't throw away cold baked po-
tatoes. Peel and slice them and make
into a German potato salad.

Don't throw away the paraffin from
jelly and marmalades. Wash each
piece and save it. Boil the accumula-
tion and there will be clean paraffin for
next jelly time.

Don't throw away the coarse green
leaves of celery. Dry them in the oven
for flavoring soups and sauces.

Don't throw away any lemon and
orange peels. Dry and powder for
flavoring, or cut into shreds and boil in
a white syrup for a sweetmeat.

Don't neglect your refrigerator.
Clean it daily, and twice a week place in
it a saucer containing charcoal. This
is a great aid in keeping it sweet.

Don't fail to keep your pantry clean.
Food lasts longer when kept in a clean
place. This also applies to your cellar.

A PINEAPPLE ECONOMY.

Put the pineapple parings in a
sauce-pan, cover with water, add
one-half cupful of sugar, and let
simmer for one hour. Strain
through a cloth, and you have a
real pineapple tea, which is de-
licious either alone or with
lemon-juice and ginger ale ad-
ded.

Autos And Road Construction.

A few weeks ago automobile
races were held on the track of
the Canadian National Exhibit-
on. Manager Orr now reports
that these races have completely
ruined the track and that no
practical use can be permitted in
these exhibition tracks, it is
stated by way of explanation,
are simply "mud up roads." They
are not laid on a concrete
base, but merely gravelled over
a broken stone bottom. In
other words they are precisely
the same sort of roads that one
finds on the best rural highways
of the Province. Still some of
these country roadways are sub-
jected, in the height of the
summer season, to treatment
little less severe than that under
which the Exhibition track has
broken down. It is true cars
are seldom run at 70 to 90 miles
an hour on rural highways, but
60 miles is not uncommon and
40 miles an hour is a frequent
occurrence. And yet farmers
living along these lines of motor
travel are expected to go on
uncomplainingly keeping the
highways in repair. To talk of
taxing owners of autos for this
purpose is futile. If the cars
were taxed annually to the ex-
tent of their total value, the sum
so raised would not more than
make good the damage caused
on roads extensively used by
auto owners.

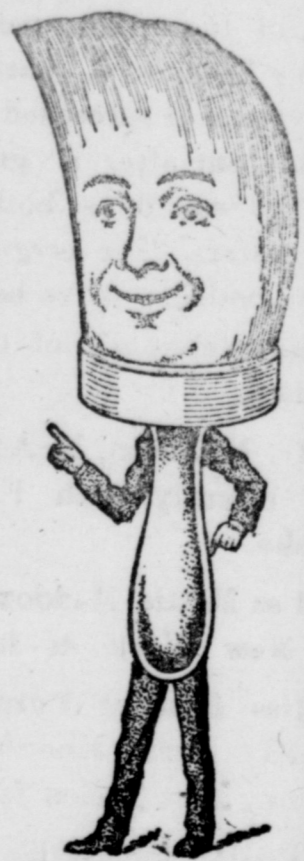
