**Cyclone Destroyed Several
Villages**

Budapest, Hungary, May 14.—A number of villages, including Balvanijos, Verelja and others in Transylvania, were practically razed to the ground and many of the inhabitants killed and injured by a cyclone which swept over the district last evening. Out of 350 houses, 230 were reduced to ruins. Four bodies have thus far been extracted from the debris and the number of possible seriously injured is very large. Other villages, including Csaba, Ujfalu and Batonya were also greatly damaged by the storm. Count Bethen, the governor of the province, has ordered all the troops stationed in the district to assist the firemen in salvage work.

Neptune Jumps Contracts

Joe Neptune, the Indian player who figured in the N. B. and Maine League last season and who is a subject of dispute between the Woodstock and

Houlton clubs, is "in bad" in the Greater Boston League for jumping the South Boston team to come back to this league. There are other players in the same position. The Boston Globe has the following:

"Three of the most promising players of the South Boston Greater Boston League team have jumped to independent clubs in Maine. They are Outfielders Neptune and Doyle and Galligan. They have been suspended by the secretary of the league. Neptune and Galligan were under two years' contract with the new league."

**Halifax Wharf Collapses With 60
Men; No One Hurt**

Halifax, N. S., May 21—
Forty stevedores at work

on the wharf of T. A. S. DeWolfe & Co. had a narrow escape tonight when about sixty feet of the wharf collapsed. A number of the men became entangled in the wreckage when the cave-in occurred.

The stevedores were engaged in discharging bags of salt from the steamer Tobasco. The salt was being placed in a shed on the wharf, which contained about 1,800 bags aggregating in weight about 180 tons. Fortunately no one was hurt but the stevedores were very much frightened.

Launch of Biggest Vessel in World

HAMBURG, Germany, May 23.—The Hamburg-American Line new mammoth trans-Atlantic steamer Imperator was successfully launched here this morning. Emperor William acted as sponsor.

Among the innovations introduced into the new vessels, as a result of the Titanic tragedy, the company has determined to swing out board the lifeboats in which room is provided for every soul carried by the steamer and be thus in readiness for launching at any moment. The Imperator will carry three wireless operators, thus providing for continuous service.

Few To Mourn For Richeson

Boston, May 22—The funeral of Clarence V. T. Richeson, who was electrocuted yesterday for the murder of Miss Avis Linnell, took place this afternoon in the vestry of the Warren avenue Baptist church. Rev. Herbert S. Johnson, who was one of Richeson's spiritual advisers up to the moment of the electrocution, and who is pastor of the church, conducted the services.

Less than a score of people were in attendance. Before beginning the service, Mr. Johnson refused to state what disposition would be made of the body.

**Another Gold Rush into Wilds of
North Ontario**

North Bay, Ont., May 22—Another gold rush is in full swing, following discoveries of gold and copper in the region north of Massy Station, on the Soo branch of the Canadian Pacific railway

by a prospector named Teasdale. Prospectors are flocking in large numbers to the scene of the latest excitement, which entails a forty-mile drive north of Massey to Whiskey Lake, then a canoe trip some miles further into the wilderness.
