Peanut Sandwiches

There are several ways of using peanuts for sandwiches. They may be simply pounded or chopped fine, well sprinkled with salt, moistened with a few drops of olive oil, and spread thickly between slices of buttered bread. Or they may be powdered and stirred in mayonnaise for the filling, mixed with cream cheese and spread between crackers or slices of thin buttered bread. Another way: With a biscuit cutter cut slices of bread round, cover with whipped cream (not sweetened); mash some peanuts fine and sprinkle thickly over the cream. Nice for afternoon luncheons.

Baked Parsnips

Scrape the parsnips and boil until tender, then slice them lengthwise. Have ready in a dripping or roasting pan some hot drippings or butter. Lay in the parsnips, sprinkle with sugar, a little salt and pepper, and let them brown nicely in the oven; when one side is browned, turn and brown on the

Chocolate Hard Sauce

A delicious sauce for steamed plum pudding may be made by first making hard sauce with butter and powdered sugar. When light and creamy add the white of an egg and two or three tablespoons of cold melted chocolate. Beat until the egg is frothy, then add a little vanilla.

Round Steak Boiled




