Brought Out Alive From Coal Mine

DULUTH. Minn., May 15. - Six men were taken alive from the Oliver Iron Mining Company's mine at Ironwood, last night, the last man being rescued at 11 o'clock. Two bodies of dead miners have been recovered. Thirteen men were entombed by the cave-in. Five bodies are still in the mine.

Death of The King of Denmark.

By the death of King Frederick VIII., of Denmark, more grief is added to the lot of the royal house of Great Britain. for the dead monarch was a brother of Queen Alexandra, widow of King Edward, and beloved in every quarter of the British Empire, and his second son is married to a sister of King George. King Frederick's death was quite unexpected, although he had not been in good health for some time. The monarch was renowned for his democratic manners, and he was exceedingly popular with the people over whom he had reigned six years. It is pointed out as a "curiosity of fate" that he saw his younger brother and his own son become reigning monarchs before he himself ascended the throne of Denmark. His brother William was elected King of Greece in 1863, and Frederick's second son, Prince Charles, was elected Haakon VII., after the separation of Norway from Sweden in 1905. Through his brothers and sisters and his own children, Frederick was connected with most of the roy alhouses of Europe. One became Queen of Great Britain, another the wife of the late Czar Alexander III., and a third the wife of the Duke of Cumberland. Of his two brothers, William became King of Greece, while Prince Weldemar allied the family by marrying Marie d'Orleans, eldest daughter of the Duc de Chartres. While not a brilliant man, King Frederick was a wise and judicious ruler.-St. John

A New Break in Mississippi Levee

NEW ORLEANS. May 15, - Approximately 60,000 persons and 1,000 square miles of territory will be affected by a break in the Mississippi levee on the west bank, 25 miles north of here.

Early this morning the crevasse was started. It was 200 feet wide. This and the Hymelia levee was the scece of the worst break of the flood of 1804.

A boat, with laborers, has gone to try to make repairs. The revenue cutter Windom probably wiil be rushed to the scene with supplies during the day.

Quebec Boom Breaks and 100,000 Logs are Carried Away

Quebec, May 14-As a result of the violent south wind blowing today the boom of the Baie St. Paul Lumber Company broke at about noon today carrying away one hundred thousan logs. The loss will be heavy as it is quite probable that scarcely half the logs will be saved.



WHO'S WHO IN CANADA 8

HON. G. H. MURRAY,

Nobody visits Cape Breton without carrying away lasting impresisons of its picturesque scenery. But wealth and beauty are not its only pride and glory. From that island, divided by lake and canal into two islands, have gone forth sons and daughters whose names stand high among Canada's good and great. Hon. George Henry Murray, Nova Scotia's premier, is one

Premier Murray was born at Grand Narrows, N.S., in the island of Cape Breton, in 1861. He is of Scotch descent, a Presbyterian in religion and a Liberal in politics; a combination quite palatable in Victoria County, of which he is one of the representatives. Mr. Murray received his elementary training in the public schools of his native place and then entered the profession of law under the firm name of Murray & McKenzie in North Sydnev. In 1889 he was appointed to the Legislative Council. Later he was an unsuccessful candidate for the House of Commons in the country of Cape Breton. Political success came to him in 1891 when he was appointed Member of the Fielding Administration, without portfolio. In 1895 he was created Q. C. When Hon. William S. Fielding resigned, Lieut-Governor Daly called upon Mr. Murray to form a new administration. This was done by the premier in a creditable manner,

he himself taking the portfolio of

Provincial Secretary. Hon. George H. Murray has retained his seat in the local House with practically no opposition, being either reelected by acclamation or by a large majority.

HON. A. K. McLEAN

A prominent young member of the Nova Scotia Government, Hon. A. K. McLean is surely destined for yet higher honors in the land of his nativity. During the present par-liament Mr. McLean has filled the responsible position of Attorney General, and it may perhaps not be too

C. F. HAMILTON, M.A.


