Iodine Stains

Iodine stains can be removed either

To Mend Hot Water Bags

Apply several coats of liquid court-
plaster to the holes, allowing each coat
to dry before adding the next. The re-
sult will be waterproof and not affected
by hot water.

Suet pudding

One cup molasses, 1 cup of sweet milk
1 cup chopped suet, 2 1-2 cups flour, 1-2
teaspoon grated nutmeg, 1 teaspoon
soda, 1-2 teaspoon salt, 1 pound of chop-
ped walnuts, 1-4 pound chopped figs.
Steam 2 1-2 hours.

Rhubarb Pudding

Sift together two cupfuls of flour, a
pinch of salt, spices as desired, two
teaspoonfuls of baking powder and half
a cupful of sugar. Stir in one egg beat-
en with half a cupful of milk and two
tablespoonfuls of butter; add two cup-
fuls of rhubarb cut into small pieces
(use the pink part with the skin left on)
bake twenty minutes and serve with a
sauce.

Prune Sponge

Soak 1 pound of French prunes over
night in enough water to cover them.
In the morning stew in the same water
till tender; add 1 cup of sugar and put
through a sieve to retain all stones and
skins. To the pulp add 1-2 package or
2 tablespoons gelatine softened in 1-2
cup of water, the juice of 1 lemon and 1
orange; beat until foamy, then add the
stiffly beaten whites of 2 eggs and beat
again until all are thoroughly mixed and
then mould.

Prunes With Rhubarb

Those who find rhubarb alone too tart
for their taste may stew prunes with it.
Soak the prunes and stew gently in very
little water, cooking the rhubarb separat-
ely with sugar; then put the two to-
gether and heat, but do not cook so as
to boil the prunes to rags; serve like
other rhubarb sauce. A few figs cut
up and stewed with the rhubarb will
also give a pleasant flavor.

Waldorf Salad

Chop rather finely four tart apples
(squeezing over a little lemon juice), add
two cupfuls of chopped white celery and
one cupful of mixed nut meats; toss the
ingredients lightly together, blending in
a large cupful of white mayonnaise dress-

THE FLEA.

**How to Knock the Gizzards Out
of Him.**

Fleas are wingless flies, and they
are supposed to have lost their wings
through long disuse, living as they do
among the hair, wool or clothing of
other animals. As, in all other flies,
the mouth is formed for sucking, and
has no teeth. How does a flea bite?
The feet are furnished with long
double claws, sharper than needles,
and mounted in such a way as to be
just right for digging. When his
flea ship desires a feast he selects a
spot on the bare skin, sits down on
his haunches like a dog digging for a
rat, and deliberately burrows a hole
into his victim. Having penetrated
to the vein, he drops his proboscis
into the cavity and sucks up the pre-
cious blood, much after the fashion
of an elephant drinking from a
trough.

While digging, the claws are mani-
pulated so rapidly as to feel to the
victim like one continuous push of a
tooth.

Besides losing their wings their
bodies have become flattened trans-
versely from living in close quarters,
and they have become possessed of
exceedingly stiff bristles or hairs, all
pointing backward, so that in strug-
gling every movement pushes them
forward. That is why it is so diffi-
cult to catch them even when there
is no room for them to jump. "When
you put your finger on him, he isn't
there."

When a house become infested with
fleas the family dog or cat should
be washed every other day with car-
bolic soap to kill the adult fleas, and
if the animals are allowed to run
about the house, they will in a few
days attract all the fleas to them-
selves, where they can be destroyed
as above indicated. If dogs or cats
are not available as traps, gasoline
should be applied after a thorough
cleaning of the infested quarters.
Pour the gasoline into cracks in the
floor and along the baseboards, etc.,
taking care not to pour it near a fire.
Gasoline will kill both larvae and
adults as soon as it touches them.

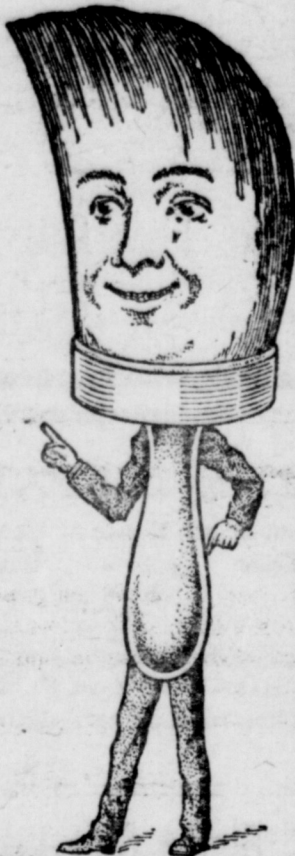
