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## Household Hints

### Beef Kidney Stew.

Cut a beef kidney in thin, round slices;  
cover with cold water, to which add a  
tablespoonful of salt. Let it stand in a  
cool place for two hours. Drain and put  
into a two-quart saucepan; cover well  
with water and add pepper—no salt.  
Put in a bay leaf if liked. Boil gently  
for two hours—never fast—until it is  
as tender as a young chicken. Have  
ready a pint bowl of potatoes cut into  
dice. Fifteen minutes before serving  
add the potatoes. When they are done  
thicken the gravy with browned flour  
rolled in butter. Have ready cooked  
some rice or spaghetti, tender but not  
broken. Put the sliced kidney into the  
centre of a heated platter and the pota-  
toes. Be careful always to have plenty  
of gravy. Leave room for a border of  
the rice or spaghetti. Sprinkle over  
this white border finely chopped parsley.

### Pineapple Pie.

Strain the liquor from a can of minced  
pineapple. Put the liquor in a bowl and  
add to it two heaping tablespoonfuls of  
flour, a cup and a half of sugar, three  
eggs (the yolks only, beaten light) two  
cups of boiling water and, last of all,  
the chopped or minced pineapple. Pour  
into an open crust and bake. Make a  
meringue for the top of the pie of the  
whites of the eggs beaten light with a  
little powdered sugar.

### Cocoanut Candy

Grate fine the meat of one cocoanut;  
put into a kettle with two pounds of fine  
granulated sugar, the beaten white of  
one egg, the milk contained in the nut.  
Stir together over the fire, being care-  
ful not to scorch, until it has the appear-  
ance of granulating, or turning back to  
sugar, then take off immediately and  
pour into a buttered dish, little molds,  
or make into round cakes. Lay on  
buttered paper to harden. Ice with a  
thick chocolate icing on top.

### Coffee Fruit Cake

One-half cup of brown sugar, one-half  
cup of molasses, one-half cup of butter,  
one-half cup of strong, clear coffee, two  
eggs, two full cups of flour with one  
teaspoonful of baking powder sifted  
with it, one small teaspoonful of soda,  
half teaspoonful of salt, cinnamon,  
cloves and ginger, each. Stir in the  
last thing three-fourths of a cupful of  
fruit—English currants, raisins and  
citron well floured to keep them from  
sinking to the bottom of the dough.  
Bake in a moderate oven.

### For Skin Eruptions

Put two tablespoonfuls of Epsom salts  
into a cup of boiling water, let stand  
until dissolved, then apply to the face,  
letting it dry in, doing it as often as  
possible until the eruptions disappear.

### Cure for Rheumatism

A year or so ago, Lord Anson, of  
London, is said to have paid a physician  
\$1,500 for a recipe for a cure for rheu-  
matism, for the sole purpose of making  
it public. It is as follows:

Sulphur, one ounce; cream of tartar,  
one ounce; rhubarb, one-half ounce;  
gum guaiacum, one dram; honey, six-  
teen ounces.

A tablespoonful of this is taken night  
and morning in a tumblerful of lemon-  
ade.

### Rhubarb Cobbler

Sift together two cups of flour, two  
teaspoonfuls of baking powder, one tea-  
spoonful of salt, and rub in two table-  
spoonfuls of butter. Beat one egg very  
light, add to it three-fourths, cups of  
milk, and mix with flour into a soft  
dough. Line the sides of a baking dish  
with the crust, fill the dish with small  
pieces of rhubarb sweetened with al-  
most equal amount of sugar; cover the  
top of the dish with the crust; make an  
opening in the center and bake for half  
an hour. Serve with whipped or plain  
cream.

If rhubarb is at all tough, scald well  
by pouring boiling water over and let  
stand until cool. This will make it  
tender enough to put into the pie  
crust.

### Warned Against Sensationalism

MONTREAL, May 8.—Four gradu-  
ates of the Wesleyan Theological Col-  
lege received a solemn warning against  
sensational pulp tactics from Rev. Dr.  
S. P. Rose of Toronto at the college  
convocation last evening. "The patient  
medicine method of attracting and keep-  
ing your congregation is an extremely  
dangerous one, and will work out in  
church life as the patent medicine will  
in the life of the body," he declared.

### TO PREVENT DRAUGHT

If one fears a draught from the open

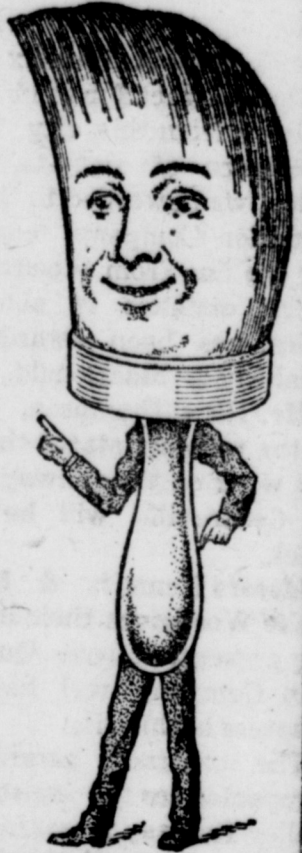
