Methodists Eight To One In Favor Of Church Union

Toronto, April' 1-Official figures of the Methodist vote on the proposed union between the Methodist, Presbyterian and Congregational churches of Canada, were compiled today and show a proportional vote of almost eight to one in favor of organic union on the proposed basis

The figures show that more than 500 quarterly official boards have completed the vote and almost 200 congregations, from all parts of the dominion.

A very peculiar state of affairs



is shown in the quarterly official board vote. Of the 500, twenty boards voted for union while one voted against. And yet this great proportional vote by the boards is reduced to eight to one in individual votes when all the figures are taken. Only about twenty-five boards of the 500 cast straight vote against
