**Household Hints**

A good ironing stand is a wire covered mat. This not only cleans the iron, but will not scorch the sheet.

When blacking a stove mix a little turpentine in the polish and it will make it look like new.

To make brass candlesticks look like new, use the simple old remedy of sour milk and salt.

A slice of Irish potato will clean oil paintings without injury, and dipped in soda is excellent to brighten silver.

To clean willow furniture use salt and water. Apply it with a stiff brush. Scrub well and dry thoroughly.

If stamps have become glued together, lay a thin paper on them and run a hot iron over it.

If the neck of a sweater becomes stretched too wide, dip the neck part in clear warm water, wring lightly and hang up to dry. It will resume its original shape and size.

When the gas range needs cleaning, remove the loose parts and place them in the furnace on a good bed of coals.

If a coat lined with fur is wrinkled, take a wet sponge and go over it thoroughly, then hang on a clothes-hanger in the open air and the wrinkles will disappear.

It is claimed that filigree work on silverware will be brightened and cleaned by letting lie in buttermilk for a day. The acid in the buttermilk clears the silver without damaging it.

Mud stains on garments should be allowed to get thoroughly dry before attempting to remove them. When perfectly dry hang in the sun for a few hours, then brush out carefully. If stains appear, try rubbing the spots with a flannel dipped in alcohol. Brush well before trying anything else.

**Sausage Roll.**

Make a dough as for baking powder biscuit; roll out and cut in large rounds; lay sausage meat on one half of each round, turn the other half over and pinch edges together. Lay in a baking pan and bake for half hour. Good hot or cold.

**Making Soap:**

Here is a good soap recipe: To make soap, measure twelve quarts of soft water; take six quarts and put over the fire in a large lard or soap kettle; when it comes to a boil, add five pounds of tallow, or any kind of grease (even cracklings, after frying out the grease); let the grease boil a few minutes and then gradually stir in a one pound box of concentrated lye; while it is boiling, put four ounces each of borax and sal soda into a quart of water you have already measured; set on the back of the stove until both are dissolved. When the soap begins to get "ropy," which will be in perhaps half an hour (but give it time), for it must "rope" off the stirring paddle, add the borax and soda; stir well and gradually stir in the remaining five quarts of cold water until thoroughly mixed; then dip out into any vessel or mold, let get cool, cut into bars and dry thoroughly in the air.

**EXTRAORDINARY ADVERTISING**

**A Beef Firm Offered to Pay the Nicaraguan Government a Heavy Sum If Allowed to Permit the Sides of Its Warships Placarded with Ads.**

A striking novelty in what might be called political advertisement has just been hit upon by an English M.P. Wishing to draw attention to the need for reform in the present electoral system, he has had a number of blue poles erected on a conspicuous site in the Strand.

These poles, which vary in size from eight inches to twenty-two feet, represent the number of voters in each constituency. Below appears in large letters the inscriptions: "Each upright, whatever its size, counts the same in the lobby. Is this fair?" And the thousands of people who have stopped and stared, have walked on chucking over the neatness of the idea.

But some of the most startling advertising ideas have never gone beyond the idea stage. When the new King George stamps were being designed, a well-known firm offered a good many tens of thousands a year for the right to use the reverse sides of the stamps, as well as the blank stamp-paper, as advertising space. The Government, however, firmly declined the offer.

**On Cliffs and Stamps**

It was a firm of equal enterprise that some fifteen years ago talked of having an illuminated advertisement in gigantic lettering on the face of Dover cliffs. The smart firm probably knew quite well that they would never be permitted to, but the newspaper talk of the project was a good enough advertisement in itself.

**Beef on Battleships**

In the U. S. A., laws in restraint of the more blatant form of advertising are practically non-existent. Some of the growing towns of the West spend money like water on advertising their own merits. One may see trainloads carrying big inscriptions like, "Here is another batch of wise men. They are settling down at Portland." In many a town all the inhabitants pledge themselves always to wear a button-badge with the town's name and motto.

But probably the most startling idea on record is that of the big Chicago beef firm, which proposed to pay the Nicaraguan Government heavily if in return it would permit the sides of its warships to tell forth the glories of a certain pressed beef. And it was only by a narrow majority that Nicaragua refused to turn its fleet into sandwich-boards.

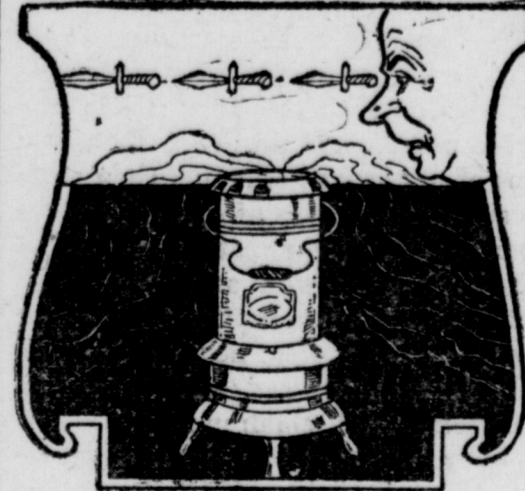
