A W Hay Named as Special Agent of Farm Board

(Wed. Jan. 22nd.)

Mr. A. W. Hay of Woodstock has resigned as a commissonier of the Farm Settlement Board and has been appointed as a special agent of the Dominion Immigration Department to act in conjunction with the Farm Settlement Board in the carrying out of the Ready Made Farms policy in New Brunswick.

Mr. Hay has already entered upon the duties of his new position and arrived from Woodstock Tuesday evening. He is at the Barker House today and has been in consultation today with Mr. A. B. Wilmot, the Dominion Immigration agent for New Brunswick with headquarters in this city. Both are to co-operate in carrying on the work of the Farm Settlement Board purchased as well as be in charge of all imprevements made in properties under the provisions of the act and with

The Farm Settlement Board have thus far invested upwards of \$30,000 in the purchase of various properties in the province and about as fast as properties are located and purchased they are resold under the provisions of the act. Last week a property at Canterbury Station, York County, was purchased and this evening Mr. Hay, accompanied by Mr. Wilmot, will go to Stanley to inspect several properties there preparatory to their being taken over by the Board. Three properties at Glassville, Carleton county, were also purchased by Mr. Hay last week.

Air Pressure.

At the level of the sea the pressure of the atmosphere on the piston of an engine is about fifteen pounds to the square inch, but decreases at higher altitudes. As this atmospheric pressure must be overcome by the steam pressure 1 fore any work can be done, it is evident that at the diminished air pressure of high altitudes more work can be obtained from a given pressure of steam than at the sea level; or, in other words, an equally effective pressure of steam can be obtained with the expenditure of less fuel. The difference, however, is not great enough to be of any practical importance.
