MONDAY PUDDING.
Cut bits of entire wheat bread
into dice. Use a half cup of any
fruit that may have been left over,
prunes, raisins, chopped dates or
canned fruit. Grease an ordinary
melon mold; put a layer of fruit,
ect., until you have the mold filled.
Beat three eggs, without separat-
ing, with four tablespoons sugar;
add a pint milk; pour over the
bread; let stand for ten minutes,
then put the lid on mold and
steam or boil continuously for one
hour. Serve with lemon or orange
sauce.

GINGER PUDDING.
Mix two pounds of bread crumbs
with three-quarters of a pound of
finely chopped suet, half an ounce
of ground ginger, quarter of a
pound of coarse sugar, three eggs
well beaten, one pound of molasses
and two teaspoons of baking pow-
der. If the mixture seems a little
stiff add a very little milk. Pour
into buttered mold, giving plenty
of room for it to swell; cover and
steam one hour and a quarter.
Fruit may be added if a richer
pudding is desired.

GINGER DROP COOKIES.
One cupful of light brown sugar
two-thirds of a cupful of butter,
one-half cupful of cold water, one
egg, two thirds of a cupful of
molasses, one large tablespoonful
of ginger, one large tablespoonful
of soda, and flour to make a thick
batter. Drop by spoonfuls on a
well-greased pan. Bake in a
moderate oven.

HOT SLAW.
Butter the size of an egg, one-half
cup of sweet milk, yolks of two eggs,
one teaspoonful of salt, one-quarter
teaspoonful of pepper, small level teaspoon-
ful of ground mustard, one-half cup
vinegar. Put the butter into the skil-
let with the finely chopped cabbage and
other ingredients, and stir constantly
until the cabbage heats through.
