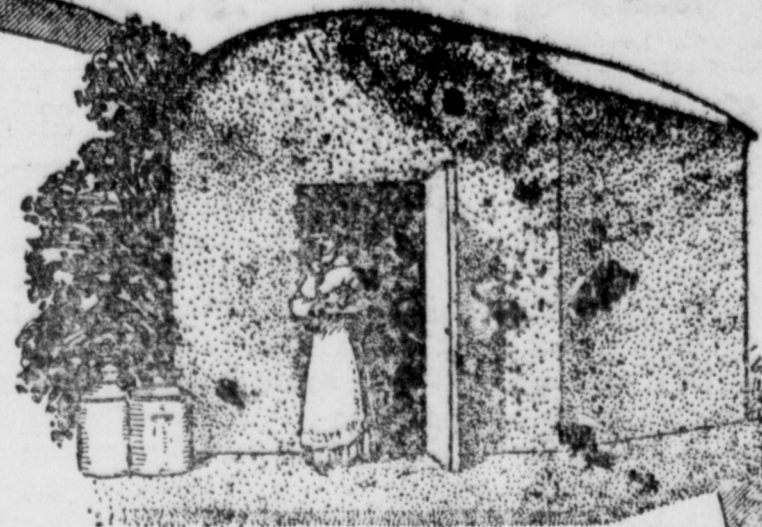

Edmonton Had a Disastrous Fire

Edmonton, Jan. 17.—Fire in Edmon-
ton's wholesale district last night caused
a loss of probably four hundred
thousand dollars and took the lives of
several Italians. The blaze started
after midnight from an unknown cause
in the five storey brick block of the Can-
ada Rubber Company, which was com-
pletely destroyed in less than an hour.
Fire then spread to the two storey
frame building occupied by the Edmon-
ton Produce Company, the Western
Cartage Company, the Vernon Fruit
Company, the Dominion Brokerage
Company, and the Snowden Oils Com-
pany. This building was also completely
destroyed. The sudden and unexpected
collapse of a high wall of the Canada
Rubber building crushed a small ad-
joining shack occupied by four Italians.
Fire Chief Auder was overcome by
smoke and taken to the hospital, but
will recover.

**Cargo of Powder Explodes in
Nanaimo**

Nanaimo, B. C., Jan. 16.—When
leaving Nanaimo harbor with a cargo
of powder, the steamer Oscar took fire,
and getting beyond control was
beached on Protection Island. The
powder exploded, destruction resulting
in Nanaimo of several thousand dol-
lars worth of property. Every plate
glass window facing the waterfront
was broken, and a number of persons

**Women Placed On Equality With
Men.**

LONDON, JAN 16.—Women won an-
other step towards equality with men
yesterday, when the Royal Geographi-
cal Society, by a vote of 130 to 51, adopt-
ed a motion by Lord Curzon, of Kedles-
ton, to admit them as fellows on the
same terms as men. Lord Curzon an-
nounced that a referendum by corres-
pondence on this subject had resulted in
2,189 votes in favor of admitting women
to 87 against.

The agitation against flannelette,
which has been going on in England
is said to have had one remarkable re-
sult—Children's flannel dresses, under-
garments and bedclothes are to be plat-
ed with tin as a protection against fire.

It was, of course, on account of its
inflammability that bishops and other
celebrities have been trying to suppress
the sale of flannelette. The tin plating
is designed to remove the danger while
preserving all the comforts of the
material.

Mrs. Susan Devin, of New York, who
gave \$10,000 to the working girl's home
on West Fourteenth street recently, will
build a new home of similar character in
Columbia University district. She paid
\$50,000 on Monday for a site, 75x100 feet
on the north side of One Hundred and
Twenty-second street, 260 feet west of
Morningside Theatre. The total outlay
will be near \$175,000. Mrs. Devin intends
that the home shall be self-supporting
in part, the rates to range from \$3 to \$5
a week. There will be quarters for 100
girls in the five-story building.

Magrath, Alberta, Jan. 20—Riders

for their own purposes, and at the same

Economy of Concrete.

At a recent meeting of the Concrete
Institute of London, held at the United
Service Institution, E. R. Matthews in
a paper on "Re-enforced Concrete
Chimney Construction" stated that
during the past seven years one Amer-
ican firm alone of Chicago has erected
nearly a thousand concrete chimneys
in America. The advantages were
found to be that the cost is one-half
as much as a brick shaft, there is a
saving in space, there is an economy
of materials, the brickwork at the
base of a 300 foot shaft measuring
about four feet ten inches, while a
concrete shaft of the same height
would have an outer nine inch wall
and an inner five inch, with a four
inch space between. A concrete shaft
weighs less and has sufficient stability,
there having been but one failure re-
corded due to faulty construction. It
can be built in one-half the time re-
quired for a brick shaft, and once
constructed the concrete shaft requires
practically no repairs.
