Eggless Recipes.

EGGLESS DOUGHNUTS.

One cup of sugar, two table-
spoons of melted butter, dash of
nutmeg, one and a half cups of
sweet milk, one teaspoon of salt,
one-half cup of sour milk (sour
cream preferred), one-half teaspoon
of soda, one and a half teaspoons
of baking powder, flour to roll out.
Roll out one-fourth of an inch
thick and fry in deep, hot fat.

EGGLESS COOKIES.

One cup of sour milk, one and
a half cups of sugar, one-half cup
of butter, one teaspoon of soda,
nutmeg to taste, flour to roll out
half an inch thick.

Cream the sugar and butter,
and add the nutmeg and soda dis-
solved in the sour milk. Mix thor-
oughly and add just enough flour
to keep the dough from sticking to
the board. Cut out and sprinkle
the cookies with granulated sugar
before baking in hot oven.

EGGLESS PICE CAKE.

One cup of sugar, one-half cup
of butter, one cup of sour milk,
two cups of flour, one teaspoon of
soda, dash of nutmeg, one-half tea-
spoon of cloves, one teaspoon of cin-
namon, one cup of raisins.

Cream the butter and sugar.
Add the sour milk and the flour
sifted with the soda and spices.
Flour the raisins and mix thorough-
ly with the other ingredients.
Bake in a deep tin for a loaf cake.

A cup of nut meats makes this
cake most excellent, or the nuts
may be pressed in the icing.

CUTTING EXPENSES.

When eggs are scarce and high,
in making doughnuts, boil and
mash a good-sized potato, beat it
in with the sugar and make the
doughnuts as usual without any
egg. They will keep moist and
good.

In making pumpkin or squash
pies, in place of eggs, roll crackers
fine use as much of them in
bulk as you would of eggs: You
could not tell the difference, if you
did not know.

When you want pudding for din-
ner and have no milk, fry adding
another egg and a few more rais-
ins, and use warm water instead of
milk.

If butter becomes strong put it
in a kettle with clean water, allow-
ing a quart of water to each pound
of butter. Boil with the kettle un-
covered for two hours; then set
away to cool. When the butter
has hardened, skim it, wash, salt
and work it as in making fresh
butter. This will make the most
rancid butter almost like fresh.

TO REMOVE SHINE FROM SKIRT.

The back of a skirt, especially a tight
one, often acquires a shiny look that is
not removed by ordinary pressing. It
is often possible to remove the shine
by rubbing it on the right side with
ammonia and water, equal parts, and
then ironing on the wrong side while
damp. It should be well dried out with
the iron. If the shine is due to hard
wear which has rubbed the pile off, am-
monia will not improve it, and it should
be gently sandpapered. Lay fabric flat
on a table and pass fine sandpaper gen-
tly over it. This will bring up the pile
but it should not be done so roughly as
to wear the fabric into holes.

NUT BISCUIT.

Two cups of flour, one-half tea-
spoonful of salt, one heaping tea-
spoon of baking powder, one large
tablespoon of butter, one cup of
chopped nuts, four tablespoons of
sugar, milk to make soft dough.
Sift the flour, salt and baking pow-
der together. Rub in the shorten-
ing and the nuts chopped very fine.
Add the sugar and enough milk to
make a biscuit dough. Shape with
the hands into small balls, place
well apart on greased pans, brush
tops with milk, sprinkle some of
the chopped nuts on top and bake
in a hot oven.

The tops may be covered with
sugar and water icing if desired
when baked, or they may be split
and jelly put between the halves.
They are also delicious just served
hot with butter.

Turning Polished Nuts.

Almost all machines are made with
some nuts or bolt heads finished
"bright" or highly polished, and to set
them up tight and not mar the sur-
faces calls for more than an ordinary
monkey wrench. A special socket head
must be made to fit the head close and
used with an ordinary wrench in turn-
ing a nut. Where only a few bolts or
nuts are to be tightened take a strip
of heavy tin or zinc and bend it to the
shape of the nut to take the place of
the special socket head. The jaws of
the wrench should be perfectly paral-
lel and set up as close as possible.

Machine to Test the Voice.

Professor John A. Anderson of Johns
Hopkins, through the agency of an in-
vention and a series of experiments
carried on in the physical laboratory
of the university, declares that any
musical instrument or the human
voice may be tested as to the quality
of tone and the fact definitely learned
whether the instrument or the voice is
a good one. Those who have studied
the matter declare that it will revolu-
tionize the manufacture of musical in-
struments and will work wonderful
improvements in the musical world.

Strength of Nickel Steel.

A test of nickel steel riveted joints
made from four different kinds of
commercial nickel steel showed the
strength of nickel steel to be about
two to two and a quarter times as
high as that of joints riveted with
wrought iron or mild steel rivets. The
advantage thus gained more than
counteracts increased cost.
