WHEN CLEAN SPOTS.

Use a little salt in the gasoline,
and there will not be the ob-
jectionable ring left on the goods when
dry.

OIL FINISH FOR FLOORS.

One pint of linseed oil, two
ounces of paraffin; melt together
and apply with brush or cloth
on mop stick. This should be
well rubbed in, going over a small
piece at a time.

CLEANING A HAIR BRUSH.

Mix one-half cupful of flour and
salt, then rub through the bristles
two or three times. Shake this
mixture all out and the brush will
be found to be clean as new. This
is better than washing, as it does
not soften the bristles.

TO HARDEN GREASE.

If grease gets spilled on the
floor, throw ice-cold water on it
immediately, or the coldest water
available. This will harden the
grease so that the wood will not
soak in so much of it, and it will
then be a comparatively easy mat-
ter to clean the floor.

IF A KETTLE BURNS DRY.

If your kettle burns dry take it
from the stove and place it immedi-
ately in a pan of cold water.
This will save the food from hav-
ing a scorched taste unless, of
course, it is very badly burned.

Green rough fabric was chosen for the
development of this pretty frock, which is
made in the very latest fashion and is
quite simple to carry out. The dress
closes at the front and has applied yokes.
The skirt is a two-piece model and the
dress has separate gimpes closing at the
back.

The pattern, No. 6072, is cut in sizes
34 to 42 inches bust measure. Medium
size will require 4 3/4 yards of 36-inch ma-
terial and 1/4 yard of 24-inch contrasting
goods, with 3/4 of a yard of 22-inch all-
over and 3/4 of a yard of 36-inch lining.
Width of lower edge is 2 1/4 yards.

ENAMEL YOUR STOVE PIPES

When you take down your heat-
ers, enamel the pipes before put-
ting them away. A can of stove-

ting the pipes away, by fall it is

A SIMPLE PUDDING.



Mix to a paste with two tablespoon-
fuls of butter and one large, well-
beaten egg. Form into cakes.
Dip into frying batter and fry to a
golden brown. Dry well, scatter
grated cheese over top, and serve.

CHEESE PYRAMIDS.

Mix together two tablespoons of
flour, same quantity of butter, two
tablespoonfuls grated (strong)
cheese. Make into a stiff paste
with water. Form into thin bis-
cuits, and bake in a quick oven.
When cold whisk some cream stiff-
ly, add a little grated cheese and
red pepper. Pile the cream on the
cakes just before serving.
