RUST ON NICKEL.

To remove rust from nickel
 on stoves, cover with sweet oil,
 well rubbed in, and leave to
 stand forty-eight hours; smear
 with the oil, applying freely
 with a bit of cotton wool after
 rubbing the steel, then rub with
 unslaked lime reduced to as fine
 a powder as possible.

**TO CUT GLASS WITH SCIS-
 SORS.**

Glass can be cut with scissors
 just as easily as cardboard.
 Use a large, strong pair of
 scissors. Take the glass which
 you wish to cut, hold it and the
 scissors entirely under water,
 and you may cut the glass in
 straight or curved lines, without
 break or crack.

MEDICINAL VALUE IN EGGS.

Every part of the egg is of value in
 medicine. The shell of the egg ground
 very fine, is used as an antacid, in per-
 formance to chalk in stomach troubles.
 The white of the egg is an antidote
 in case of poisoning with strong acids
 or corrosive sublimate; the poison will
 unite with the albumen, and if the
 whites of the egg be swallowed quickly
 in poisoning by these substances, the
 albumen will combine with the poison
 and protect the stomach.

An astringent poultice for the eye is
 made by rubbing a piece of alum in
 the white until it coagulates making
 alum curd.

The yolk is good in dyspeptic ail-
 ments.

**AS A PREVENTION OF INFECTION
 FROM WHOOPING COUGH.**

Recent progress in the quest for an
 antidote for the whooping cough bacillus
 is, the Springfield Republican says, the
 more gratifying because of the increas-
 ing recognition of the seriousness of a
 disease which used to be thought both
 trivial and almost inevitable. The
 United States public health service is
 circulating a statement of Dr. W. C.
 Rucker, assistant surgeon-general, who
 says that in 1911 this disease killed
 more than 10,000 children and suggests
 that patients be marked, as for example
 by a green arm band, in order that
 others may keep a safe distance. He is
 quite right in saying that if the bubonic
 plague were to kill 10,000 people in the
 United States in one year the whole
 world would quarantine against that
 country.

**Nations of Europe
 Protest To Taft**

WASHINGTON, Feb. 6.—
 When President Taft gave a hear-
 ing to day upon the new immigra-
 tion bill, he also had before him
 protests from Germany, Italy, and
 the Netherlands, against the pro-
 visions which authorize the secre-
 tary of commerce and labor to
 place inspectors, matrons and pub-
 lic health service, surgeons aboard
 immigrant ships to report to
 American immigration authorities
 upon the condition and treatment
 of immigrants en route. Another
 protest from Austria is said to be
 on the way and intimations have
 been received that France and
 England will join the protest. A

The protestations are said to
 regard the provision as an infringement
 on their sovereignty over
 their ships on the high seas and
 impugning the faith of their officials
 in the execution of the immigra-
 tion laws.

An Ominous Sign

Final returns in the late Presi-
 dential election in the United States
 show that Taft and Roosevelt
 combined polled a smaller vote
 than was secured by the regular
 Republican candidate alone in
 either of the two previous Presi-
 dential elections. They show
 further that Wilson secured a
 smaller popular vote than was
 secured by the Democratic candi-
 date in any election since that of 1892
 with the exception of the year in
 which Parker was the party can-
 didate. It is true the total vote
 polled last November was 142,000
 in excess of that recorded for
 years before. But this increase
 was more than accounted for by
 the jump in the Socialist vote from
 420,793 to 897,600.

Even more ominous than the
 increase in the Socialist vote is
 the small increase in the total
 vote. That increase really be-
 comes a decrease when all the
 facts are taken into account. It
 does not equal the number of votes
 polled by those women who had
 become enfranchised since 1908, to
 say nothing of the increase in the
 male vote in the same time. The
 increase in the vote for Socialism,
 coupled with the decrease in the
 vote for the regular candidates,
 indicates a dissatisfaction with
 existing conditions in the Union
 which does not bode well for the
 future.
