Household

Feather pulling may be checked by
dissolving powdered aloes in water
and washing the feathers of the birds
that have been plucked. This renders
the feathers distasteful to the culprits
that do the plucking.

Barnyard manure gives the best re-
sults of any of the fertilizers. In some
way the soil is most beneficially af-
fected by it. It lightens up the soil
and lets in the air, which is necessary
to the vigorous life of the rootlets.

Probably no animals are so valuable
as weed-eradicators as sheep. They
not only eat a large variety of weeds
and grasses, but they masticate so
thoroughly that almost all the seeds are
destroyed or digested, and do not sprout
from the manure.

The intending purchaser, if he knows
the value of a good foundation, will not
hesitate to pay a good figure for birds
from such a flock. The old hen with a
good record is worth more, much more,
than the pullet which has still to make
a name for herself.

One of the very best cures for scaly
leg is oil of caraway. This is best ap-
plied in an ointment made of:—1 part
of oil of caraway to 5 parts of white
vaseline. This ointment should be
rubbed into the leg, and foot every
few days until signs of the disease
disappear. Oil of caraway is very pen-
etrating.

CANE-BOTTOMED SEATS.

When cane-bottomed seats sag, spon-
ge both sides of the cane with hot soap-
suds in which a handful of salt has been
dissolved, then stand the chair in the
open air. Treated like this, the seats
will become as firm as when new, shrink-
ing into place.

SCORCH ON WHITE WAIST.

If a white shirt waist is scorched when
ironed, the brown marks may be removed
by rubbing them with a little dry
borax.

Before June Plant Some Begonias

In making plans for the summer flow-
er-beds, something may be needed that
will not only grow, but bloom, in the
shady beds under the trees or along the
north side of the house or verandah.
There is nothing so valuable for such
locations as the beautifully foliaged,
bright-hued flowered, tuberous-rooted
begonia.

These plants are very susceptible to
the cold and cannot be planted in the
open ground earlier than June 1, but
can be started in boxes in the house
much earlier, and will then be good-sized
plants by the time they can be plant-
ed in their permanent beds.

They should have rich, sandy soil, and
plenty of moisture. The flowers are red,
white, pink, and yellow, in colors, and
there are both single and double varie-
ties. The fringed tuberous-rooted be-
gonias have fringed edges, like carnations
and are valued either for bedding or
pot culture.

The scarlet veined, bronze and green
foliage makes a very attractive plant,
even before the flowers appear, but
when covered with the large branches
of the waxy flowers they are as pretty
and showy as any flower that can be
found. The flowers are produced in
great abundance through the summer
and until cut down by frost.

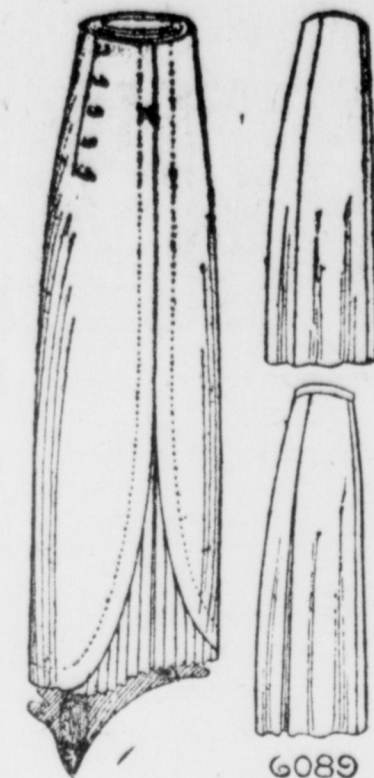
On the approach of cold weather they
will drop off, joint by joint. They
should then be dug, thoroughly dried in
the sun, and stored away for the winter
in a box of perfectly dry sand which
should be kept dry.

BAKED CORN BREAD.

Half a pint of butter-milk, half a pint
of sweet milk; add to the butter-milk
half teaspoonful of soda. Beat two
eggs, whites and yolks together, pour
the milk onto the eggs and thicken with
nine tablespoonfuls of sifted corn meal.
Put the pan in which it is to be baked
on the stove with a piece of lard the
size of an egg. When melted pour in
the batter, add a teaspoonful of salt,
stir well and bake.
