Household

ALWAYS-READY LEMONADE
There is nothing more refresh-
ing on a hot day than a long drink
of cool lemonade, but however an-
xious the hostess may be to serve
this beverage, it is sometimes im-
possible to do so owing to the lack
of necessary ingredients. In fact;
it is for just this reason that the
syrup that may be prepared by the
following recipe is one of the great-
est of household conveniences. It is
delicious, but what is still more
important it enables one to procure
a supply of lemonade literally
at a moment's notice. Extract the
juice from a dozen large lemons;
grate the rind of six of the lemons,
and add to the juice. Let the mix-
ture stand for twelve hours over-
night. In the morning make a
thick syrup of granulated sugar
and water, using about six pounds
of the sugar, and just as little wa-
ter as possible, as the syrup must
be both thick and smooth. When
it has cooled, strain the lemon
juice into it; bottle in glass, being
certain that the tops are secure and
air-tight. In making lemonade
with this syrup, place a little crush-
ed ice in the bottom of a tall glass
add one or two teaspoonfuls of the
syrup, according to taste, and fill
with either carbonated or plain
water.
This syrup may also be used suc-
cessfully in making cakes, pie-
pudding, custards, etc., being a
most economical method of utiliz-
ing lemons, as it enables the cook
to obtain absolutely the full value
of both sugar and fruit. Surely
this is a fact worthy of considera-
tion by the economical housewife.

Canning The First Fruits.
With the coming of rhubarb
and strawberries the canning season
is on its way.
More and more are house-keepers
learning to combine fruits and
to extend the flavoring powers to
those high in price by using a
cheaper fruit as a base. Nothing

strawberries disagrees with many

HOUSEHOLD NOTES.
Coffee stains may be removed
from table linen by rubbing with
pure glycerine then washing in
lukewarm water.
In papering bedrooms it is a
good, safe general rule to choose
light papers with scarcely any de-
sign at all upon them.
Curtains will hang straight if a
small lead weight is fastened in
the lower corners. For silk cur-
tains use a weighted braid.

Cayenne pepper is excellent to
rid cupboards of mice. The floor
should be gone over carefully, and
each hole stopped up with a piece
of rag dipped in water and then in
cayenne pepper.

When a tin lid is very hard to
remove, instead of struggling to
loosen it with a knife just hold the
tin endways and give a few taps
with a hammer, and it will loosen
immediately.

If great care is not taken flat
irons easily become rusted. The
following is a good way to clean
them when this occurs. Tie a
lump of beeswax in a piece of rag,
and when the irons are hot rub
them with this. Then rub them
well with salt on a cloth, and they
will be quite smooth and clean.

To remove the deposit from the
inside of kettles, fill the kettle
with water and add to it a drachm
of sal-ammoniac. Let it boil for
an hour, when the fur found on
the metal will be dissolved, and
can be easily removed. Rinse the
kettle well, then boil out once or
twice before using the contents.

Pineapple and Rhubarb.
In combining pineapple and rhu-
barb use one part of pineapple to
two parts of rhubarb, allowing a
large cup of sugar for a pint of cook-
ed fruit. Shred the pineapple and
cook until tender in just enough
water to cover it. Cut the rhu-
barb and add to the pineapple. Cook
until soft, then add the sugar.
Boil the mixture for twenty min-
utes, then seal. This make a
delicious preserve.
