Household

Canned Cherries.

For three pints of fruit use 1 1-2
cup water and 1 cup of sugar for
each quart jar. Put the sugar and
water in a kettle and let it come to
a boil. Pit the cherries and add.
Simmer ten minutes, or until the
fruit is thoroughly scalded. Then
fill the jars until the juice runs
over. Seal as once.

Preserved Cherries.

Select ripe, sour cherries wash
and stone them. Take equal parts
of fruit and sugar and allow one-
half cup of water to each pound of
fruit. Place alternate layers of
fruit and sugar in preserving Ket-
tle and allow this to stand for one
hour. Then add the water and
put over the fire. Let the mixture
simmer slowly until the cherries
are clear and the syrup very thick.
Seal at once.

Cherry Jam.

Select well-ripened cherries,
stone them and remove all stems.
As cherries sour readily after being
stoned, all preserved or canned
cherries should be cooked as soon
after pitting as possible. If there
must be some delay, however,
sprinkle the fruit with powdered
sugar. In making cherry jam, al-
low one pound of granulated sugar
to each pound of cherries. Mix
the sugar and fruit place over the
fire and boil until thick. The
sweet cherries do not make as finely
flavored jam as do the plain, sour
cherries.

Stick Candy.

One pound of granulated sugar
and one cup of water, a quarter
of a cupful of vinegar, or half a
teaspoonful of cream tartar, and
one small tablespoonful of glyce-
rine. Boil without stirring for
twenty minutes, or until it will
crisp when dropped into water.
Just before pouring upon greased
platters, add half a teaspoonful of
soda. Be careful to skim off any
skum that rises while the candy
is boiling. If part of it is wanted
to be colored, so as to stripe the
stick, add the coloring while pull-
ing part of it, then pull together
to "stripe it." After pouring the
candy flavoring may be poured over
the top, or it may be added while
pulling. While partly cool, pull
until very white.

Europe, Portugal, Spain and Italy
contributing 76,000, 35,000, and
32,000 respectfully to last year's
total. Russia came next with over
9,000. England contributed only
a little over 1,000. Since the in-
dustrial revival began in Germany,
the number of Germans emigrating
to the southern as well as to the
northern continent, of the few
world, has steadily decreased, and
any fear of a political clash, owing
to the large German population in
Rio Grande do Sul and the other
southern states of Brazil, frequen-
ly expressed ten or twelve years
ago, has disappeared altogether.
