LONDON, May 1.-The Dominion of Canada is going to be a favorite holiday resort during the parliamentary recess this year. In addition to Viscount Ha'dane (the Lord Chancellor), the Right Hon. Herbert Samuel (the Postmaster General), and Sir. J. A. Simon (the Solicitor General), it is now learned that twenty members of parliament who have accepted the invitation of the Australian parliament association to visit the antipodes this summer, will endeavor to travel via the Dominion. The party includes members on both sides of the house and leaves England at the end of July.

Full Crew Bill Law In New Jersey

NEWARK, N. J., May 1.-The so-called full crew bill, which was opposed so bitterly by the railroads, went into effect throughout this state to-day. The law provides that crews on freight trains of less than thirty cars shall consist of five men, and of more than thirty cars of six men. On passenger trains of not more than three passenger cars and one baggage car the crew must consist of five men, and on four or more passenger cars and one baggage car of six men. The railroads are planning to join in concerted action to test the constitutionality of the law, possibly by inviting prosecution under the penalty imposing \$100 fine for its violation.

The law is intended to insure the safety of the travelling public, but the railroads maintain that there are no duties for extra men to perform, which are not a legally performed by train crews as formerly constituted and that the new men are therefore superfluous and an unnecessary and extra expense.
