



Full Crew Bill Law In New Jersey

NEWARK, N. J., May 1.-The socalled full crew bill, which was opposed so bitterly by the railroads, went into effect throughout this state to-day. The law provides that crews on freight trains of less than thirty cars shall consist of five men, and of more than thirty cars of six men. On passenger trains of not more than three passenger cars and one baggage car the crew must consist of five men, and on four or more passenger cars and one baggage car of six men. The railroads are planning to join in concerted action to test the constitutionality of the law, possibly by inviting prosecution under the penalty impesing \$100 fine for its violation.

The law is intended to insure the safety of the travelling public, but the railroads maintain that there are no duties for extra men to perform, which are not a fequauely performed by train crews as formerly constituted and that the new men are therefore superfluous and an unnecessary and extra experse.
