### DROP CAKES.

Beat well one cup of sugar,  
one cup molasses, three whole  
eggs, one-half cup sour milk,  
one-half teaspoon soda, three  
quarters cup butter, spices to  
taste, and flour to make the cake  
batter, last of all add one cup of  
seeded raisins, frost with white  
icing and sprinkle over the top  
the tiny colored candies children  
love. The candies should be  
the size of pin heads.

### NUT SQUARES.

Separate the yolks and whites  
of four eggs and beat well. To  
the yolks add one cup of sugar,  
one cup of sifted cracker crumbs  
one teaspoonful of baking powder,  
two squares of grated chocolate,  
and two cups of English  
walnut meats ground to a powder.  
Mix thoroughly and add  
one teaspoonful of vanilla extract  
and the whites of the eggs.  
Bake in a thin sheet, then cut  
in inch squares, put together  
with jelly and frost over with  
chocolate or white icing and  
place half an English walnut on  
the top of each.

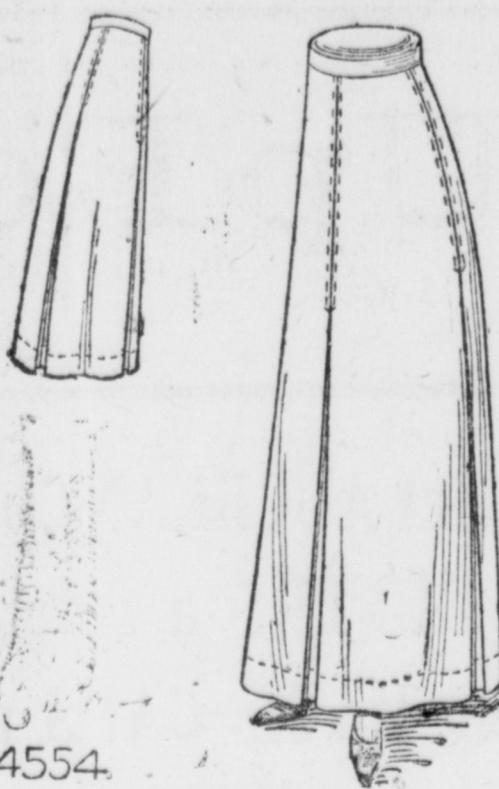

### FOR CLEANING BRASS

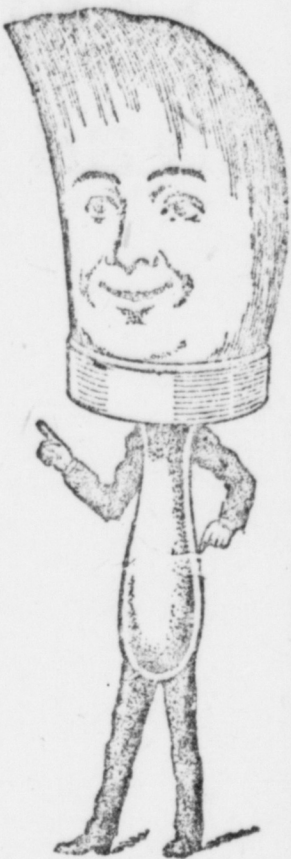
