Savory Supper Dishes.

Fried Cereals.
Any of the boiled or steamed
cereals if cooked with slightly less
water and packed in greased one-
pound baking powder tins or small
bread pans may, when cold, be
sliced thin, dipped in flour and
fried. Corn-meal, hominy and rice
are especially good cooked in this
way. Serve with honey, maple
syrup or as an accompaniment to
any cold meat or meat jelly. Chop-
ped nuts stirred in before the mush
is packed in the molds will add
greatly to any fried cereal.

Baked Cheese Dish.

A delicious supper dish is made
from a small loaf of bakers' with
half a pound of mild cheese. Cut
off the hard crusts, slice and butter
the remainder of the loaf, lay
the slices loosely in a baking dish
with alternate layers of cheese cut
in slices. Beat one egg, add a
quart of milk with a little salt.
Pour this mixture over the bread
and cheese and let it soak until
every slice is moistened. Sprinkle
small pieces of cheese on top.
Serve on hot plates.

Potatoes en Gratin.

Cook potatoes, cool and slice
thin, make a white sauce, taking
for every two cups of potatoes, one
cup of milk, two tablespoons of
butter, two tablespoons of flour,
quarter of a teaspoon of salt and
one-eighth of a teaspoon of pepper.
Put a layer of potatoes in a baking
dish, sprinkle with pepper, salt
and grated cheese, then a layer of
white sauce and repeat until dish
is full. Buttered cracker crumbs
tops. Bake about thirty minutes.

German Toast.

May be served as a savory for a
change. Beat up two fresh eggs,
mix them with about half a pint
of milk and add salt, pepper and
a little onion juice. Thoroughly
soak slices of stale bread in this
mixture and fry crisp and brown
in lard or pork dripping. It is real-
ly delicious and school children are
very fond of it for their supper.

Savory Rice.

Boil half a pound of rice in water
with one small onion chopped fine-
ly. When tender and nearly dry
stir in three tablespoons of grated
cheese, three tablespoons of toma-
to sauce, a dessert spoonful of chop-
ped parsley and herb, cayenne
and salt to taste and two ounces
of butter. The rice should be fine
enough to make a mound on the
dish.

RAILWAY FROM ARCTIC TO ANTARCTIC.

No longer looked upon as vision-
ary and impracticable is the idea
of a railway that shall link up the
Arctic and Antarctic. One of the
longest gaps has been filled up by
the completion of the great rail-
way that runs nearly the whole
length of Chile, from Iquique to
Port Mait. Extensions at both
ends, for which plans have been
made, will make the line contin-
uous from the frontier of Peru to
the Strait of Magellan. It is through
Central America and Columbia
that the greatest gaps now occur.

Another Wireless Feat.

Instances of the saving of life
through the agency of wireless
telegraphy may eventually become
too frequent to call for comment,
but not yet. At the mouth of Juan
de Fuca Strait on the desolate
rock Tatoosh, there is a lighthouse
and wireless station, which is pas-
sed by every ship going in or out
of Puget Sound, but which for
months at a time is isolated by the
winter storms and the eternal
ground swell of the Pacific, which
makes a landing difficult and dan-
gerous. Last winter the wife of
one of the lighthouse keepers be-
came seriously ill while a 60-mile
gale was piling the rocky shores
with giant breakers. Finally the
wireless was brought into service
and by means of it and a tele-
phone on shore communication
was effected with the naval hospi-
tal at the Bremerton navy-yard,
where the surgeon on duty diag-
nosed the case and gave orders as
to its treatment, with the result
that the women's life was event-
ually saved.
