WALNUT BREAD.

Here are two recipes for wal-
nut bread:
NO. 1.—Four cups flour, four
teaspoons baking powder, one tea-
spoon salt, one-half cup sugar, one
cup chopped nut-meats, two cups
sweet milk, one egg. Sift flour
and baking powder, salt and su-
gar together, add nut-meats, mix
with milk, stir all together. Let
raise twenty minutes and bake in
a moderate oven. Simple and
good.

NO. 2.—Three-quarters cup
granulated sugar, one egg beaten;
one cup sweet milk, one cup Eng-
lish walnut meats, chopped, one
small teaspoon salt, three cup-
pastry flours fed three times with
three teaspoons baking powder.
Mix sugar and beaten egg, add
milk and flour alternately, add
walnuts. Let mixture stand twenty
minutes; then bake in slow oven
or fifty minutes. Better second
day. Delicious with tea or coffee.

HOME REMEDY FOR CHAPS.

In cold, or windy weather, to
prevent the lips from chapping,
try this: Mutton tallow, warmed
and strained through a fine cloth;
one-fourth pound; raisins, one-fourth
pound; yellow bees-wax one
tablespoonful shredded. Simmer
the ingredients together slowly un-
til the raisins rise to the top; then
strain through muslin into small
jars and cool. Good for chaps,
roughness, chapped hands, cuts or
sores. It will not become rancid,
and may have a few drops of per-
fume added, if liked. Lips can be
made, keeping the same propor-
tions.

WHAT MAKES CORN POP.

A kernel of pop-corn is filled
with tightly packed starch grains.
The interior of the kernel is di-
vided into a large number of cells,
each of which may be likened to a
tiny box, the walls of which are
strong enough to withstand con-
siderable pressure from within.
Upon the application of heat, the
moisture present in each little box
is converted into steam that finally
escapes by explosion. The grain
of corn then literally "bursts in-
side out," and is transformed into
a relatively large mass of "low-
white starch."

CORN MEAL for CLEANING.

To clean a Panama hat, soak a cupful
of corn meal in benzine or gasoline, rub
this well on the hat with a clean, soft
cloth, and it will clean and leave no stain.
For the straw hat, use one teaspoonful
of oxalic acid to a cupful of water;
scour with an old tooth brush, until all

soiled spots are clean.
Many fabrics can be cleaned perfectly
by putting into hot cornmeal, wheat
bran, or flour, and rubbing just as you
would in water, using no soap. Or the
article may be put into a bag with the
meal or flour, and rubbed while in the
bag until clean, then shaken out and
"rinsed" through clean meal or flour.

be tried in Old Bailey in April,

in June or July, as would have


