To clean a panama hat, soak a cupful of corn meal in benzine or gasoline, rub soiled spots are cleau.

Many fabrics can be cleaned perfectly by putting into hot cornmeal, wheat bran, or flour, and rubbing just as you would in water, using no sosp. Or the article may be put into a bag with the meal or flour, and rubbed while in the bag until clean, then shaken out and 'rinsed'' through clean meal or flour.
