should also be put through the shrink-
ing process before cutting out. Get
wide, unbleached muslin and wet it
thoroughly, wring so it will not drip,

woollen fabric.

to 12 years. Medium size requires 3 1/4
yards of 36-inch material and 3/4 of a
yard of 27-inch contrasting goods.

but not too dry, and lay on a table or
other surface; lay the opened good on
the wet muslin and roll up together. Let
them lie for half a day or until the mater-
ial absorbs the moisture, then lay it
wrong side up, on a thickly padded sur-
face, or ironing board, and iron with a
hot iron until dry. For gingham, mus-
lins, or other cotton or linen goods,
the material may be wet thoroughly in
sufficient water, then carefully hung on
the line in the shade to partly dry, then
smooth out with a hot iron, on the
wrong side, keeping the thread of the
goods straight.

Crepe Goods Save Ironing.

The crepe goods and seersuckers are
not ironed when laundered, but should
be well shaken out and hung carefully
to avoid wrinkling as much as possible.
Seersuckers are excellent for children's
clothes, for skirts and for underwear.

Overalls for Little Girls.

Little girls, as well as small boys,
wear the overalls or romper suits at
their play, and the most inexperienced
mother can make them as they are very
simply constructed. Denim, of not too
close texture, is the best material, but
stout gingham and flannels are also used.
Any durable and washable goods may
be used.

For children's wear, the double faced
canton flannel is not so very desirable,
as it gathers dirt so easily, and is al-
ways in the wash. Gingham, or other
cottons are much better.

APPLE PUDDING.

Make a dough as for shortcake, just
stiff enough so it will stir easily with a
spoon. Place sliced apples, sugar and
seasoning in a pudding dish; pour over
it the dough and bake slowly. Serve
with cream and sugar or fruit juice.

APPLE FILLING FOR CAKE.

White of one egg well beaten, one cup
of sugar beaten in, pare and grate one
tart apple into the sugar and egg, and
spread between layers of cake. Must
be served at once or the apples will turn
dark.

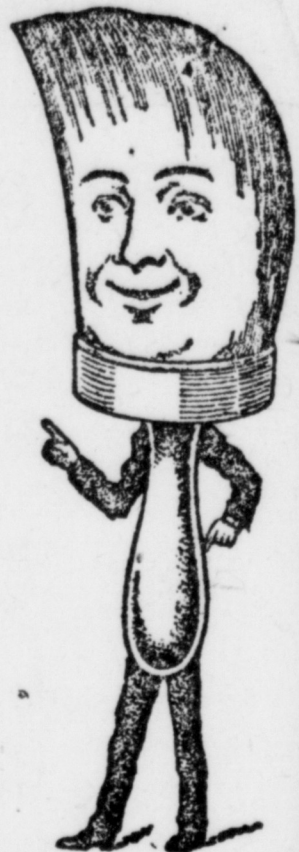

A Rich Sauce.

Another method to prepare apples
as above and drop them into boiling hot
syrup and let cook as before. This
makes a richer sauce and the apples are
more apt to remain whole. Sauce made
by either method may be served as fol-
lows: While hot, stir and mash the
apples add a little butter and set away
to cool. A liberal use of sugar is more
agreeable when served this way. But
the finest way of all to make delicious
apple sauce is to cook it in the oven,
prepare as for boiled sauce, cut into
eighths, arrange in layers in an earthen
ware vessel, sprinkling each layer with
a little sugar. Do not add any water,
as they will form their own syrup.
Bake in a moderate oven till a rich
dark red; the flavor will be entirely
different from the boiled sauce. Serve
cold with whipped cream and you will
surely have a dish fit for anyone.
