To Keep Moths Away.  
Oil of cedar sprinkled freely inside the wood of wardrobes will keep away moths without giving the clothes an unpleasant odor. Sprinkle well into the corners, but be careful that it does not touch the clothing or it may leave a stain.

Tea Leaves For Cleaning Wood.  
Save tea leaves for a few days then steep them in a pail for half an hour; strain, and use the tea to clean varnished wood. It requires very little polish, as the tea acts as a strong detergent, cleaning the paint from all impurities and making it equal to new.

Give It Up.  
The pretty lady had accidentally taken a rear seat in a tram-car reserved for smokers. With unconcealed indignation she watched the man beside her fill his pipe.

"Sir," finally came her frigid tones, "smoking always makes me feel sick."  
"Do it now, ma'am?" said the man, as he carefully lighted up; "then take my advice and 'cluck it!'"

For Ironing Day.  
A piece of sandpaper tacked to the end of the ironing board will be found very useful for cleaning the irons. A little salt will remove starch from irons. A piece of beeswax rubbed upon the iron will prevent it from sticking. Unless a drop of water will run quickly off the iron, it is not hot enough for use.

To prevent starch from sticking when ironing is done, use a tablespoonful of powdered borax to each pint of boiling starch, stirring well until it is dissolved and thoroughly mixed. Or it may be dissolved in the water in which the starch is made.

Carrots Poulette—Wash and scrape the required number of carrots, place them in a bowl of boiling water to scald. Take them out, drain, slice and put them into a saucepan of boiling water with a little butter in it and boil until done and quite tender. Put a little flour and butter into a frying pan, cook for a few minutes, sprinkle in salt and pepper to taste, and add a little lemon juice, the yolks of two eggs and some rich stock. Place the carrots in this and toss over a fire so as to cook without boiling. Turn the whole on to a warmed dish and serve at once.

Stuffed Cabbage—Procure a large head of cabbage, boil it, but remove from the fire before it is quite done, carefully take out the middle and fill the cavity with a mixture of a tablespoonful of minced suet, two tablespoonfuls of chopped bacon or ham, a like amount of other cold meat, one raw egg, the grated rind of a lemon, a little grated nutmeg, and pepper and salt to taste. Milk may be used instead of the egg if desired. Tie up with a string and place in the oven to bake for twenty minutes. Place on a warm dish and pour rich, brown gravy around, but not over the cabbage. While baking the cabbage should be frequently basted with dripping or butter, and must not be allowed to burn or become brown.

Baked Onions—Put six large onions into a saucepan with water, or with milk and water in equal

proportions; add salt and pepper, and boil till tender. When done they can be easily mashed; work them up with butter into a paste, cover with bread crumbs and bake in a moderate oven. If preferred the onions may be boiled whole, put into a baking dish, covered with butter and bread crumbs, and then baked.
