Murder Of Madero In Mexico Streets

WASHINGTON. Feb, 24.-Former President Madero and former Vice-President Suarez were killed in the streets of Mexico City, in a battle between their guard and two groups of men who were seeking to overpower the guard and rescue them, according to official telegram from Francisco De La Barra, Minister for Foreign Relations, received at the Mexican embassy early to-day. "Both the bodies of Senors Madero and Suarez," Senor De La Barra assures the embassy, "will be buried with all the honors due to the high positions they and had given him strict instructions held."

The report declared there "was a general desire for peace" thoughout Mexico, and that the government looked forward to the future with optimism.

MEXICO CITY, Feb, 24-The following official statement of President Huerta was given out at the palace:

"I called together the cabinet to report that Madero and Suarez, who had been detained at the palace at the disposition of the War Department, were taken to the penitentiary, in accordance with a previous decision, as the rerult of which that establishment was placed yesterday afternoon under the charge of an army officer for its better security When the antomobiles hal traversed about two-thirds of the way to the pen-

Madero and Pino Suarez, so that they may make a strict investigation with the direct intervention of the military prosecutor general.

"The Minister of Justice has asked that when these investigations' are over, the case being of so exceptional a character, that the prosecutor general of the republic make a futher investigation.

"The government deplores the event, and, wishing to attend to the necesstties of the public welfare, had asked the Minister of Justice to formulate a plan of legal action against the prisoners for their several responsibilities, and dangerous question.

"Filled with the desire to guarantee itself as well as the prisoners, the government had appointed Col, Louis Vallestores, director of the penitentiary, to provide for any contingency.

"The government promises that society shall be fully satisfied as to the facts in the case. It is the popular belief to-day that the formality of a government autopsy over the bodies of Madero and Suarez was held mainly for the purpose of covering up powder marks and other indications tending to show that the men were slain by executioners among their supposed guard, v ho stood close behind them. It was reported that Madero's hand was actuall burned by the flames from the weapons that killed eim, and then when the bo'y, which was examined after being turned over to his family, it was found that the hair had peen entirely cnt away from the wounds. Suarez's clothing, it is said, bore powder stains around the bullet holes. The clothing had been changed when the body was sent to his relations.

The treatment consists of an injection of a bactericidal, non-tox c serum in which has been incorporated nor -toxie tubercular lacilli.

In conjunction with this injection, he gives a preparation which supplies the deficient mineral salts, taken from the system by the tuberculosis germs.
