**ALUMINUM COOKING VESSELS.**  
Many women do not know how alu-  
minum cooking vessels should be cared  
for, and because of the effects of misuse,  
some are very much disappointed with  
the ware.

On the label attached to every piece  
of aluminum ware sent out by one re-  
liable firm of manufacturers, this is  
stated: "Do not scrape with a knife or  
other sharp instrument; do not use lye,  
ashes, ammonia, or any washing pow-  
der or soap containing free alkali. All  
of these injure and discolor pure  
aluminum. The use of water containing  
alkalies or iron darkens the inside. I  
by neglect or accident, the vessel is  
covered with burnt grease and becomes  
dark, it can be easily cleaned by using  
four tablespoonfuls of oxalic acid crys-  
tals in a gallon of water, boiling for  
not more than five minutes, then, be-  
fore using wash carefully with hot  
water and soap.

Skillets or frying pans of this metal  
will become as dark as sheet iron, if  
not kept clean. Aluminum does not  
rust nor corrode, nor oxidize in the air  
or moisture. Vegetable acids and  
vegetable alkalies are said not to dis-  
solve, or "eat," pure aluminum, and  
cleaning it with oxalic acid solution does  
not injure the metal. Food which have  
a definite acid or alkalie characte.  
should not be left standing in an alu-  
minum vessel after cooking.

Aluminum vessels for cooking are  
very desirable.

**Suffragettes Worry Royal Family**

London, Feb. 21.—The suffra-  
gettes have gone so far as to direct  
their efforts at the Royal Family,  
who, up to the present, have en-  
tirely escaped annoyance, although  
it is said that the King and Queen  
were recently grossly affronted by  
a suffragette termagant who got  
access to the private grounds of  
one of the Royal residences. The  
matter was hushed up by direc-  
tion of the King, lest the militants  
should benefit by advertisement.

Because Miss Mary Phelps  
Jacob, a New York debutante, was  
to be presented at Court to-night,  
the American colony in London  
was tremendously interested in the  
suffragettes to-day. By order of  
King George extraordinary pre-  
cautions were planned to guard  
Buckingham Palace against the  
militants during the function.

Scotland Yard men were on  
duty all day about the palace, in  
addition to the regular military  
Guardmen, and every avenue of  
approach to the Royal residence  
was under the most rigid sur-  
veillance.

Guests at the Court will be in-  
spected by both guards and deter-  
tives and compelled to submit to  
a positive identification.

By the King's suggestion all of  
the unoccupied Royal Palaces were  
under heavy guard. No one was  
allowed to approach Windsor,  
Sandringham, Balmoral and York  
Cottage. Holyrood Castle in  
Edinburgh was vigilantly wat-  
ered, and Kew Gardens were picket-  
ed by Scotland Yard men.

Mrs. Millicent Fawcett, Presi-  
dent of the National Union of  
Women's Suffrage Societies, and  
one of the best known workers in  
the cause, delivered a speech this  
afternoon, strongly denouncing  
the militant suffragists, whose  
 tactics she described as detestable  
suffrage, harmful to their aims.  
Such crimes, she declared, would  
be excusable only among savages,  
and were really a serious menace  
to civilization.

TORONTO Feb. 22.—Mr. N.  
W. Rowell, K. C., leader of the  
Opposition in the Legislature, has  
given notice that he will move on  
Monday for the immediate aboli-  
tion of the bar, together with the  
abolition of all hotel and club li-  
censes, and there-with the treat-  
ing system.

Mr Rowell will also ask for such  
restrictions upon the residue of the  
liquor traffic as experience may  
show to be necessary to limit its  
operation and effectively remedy its  
evil. Two other clauses in his  
motion are:

"The strict enforcement of the  
law by officials in sympathy with  
law enforcement and the elimina-  
tion of political influence from the  
administration of the law; and reg-  
ulation and inspection of all houses  
of public entertainment so as to en-  
sure reasonable accommodation for  
the travelling public.

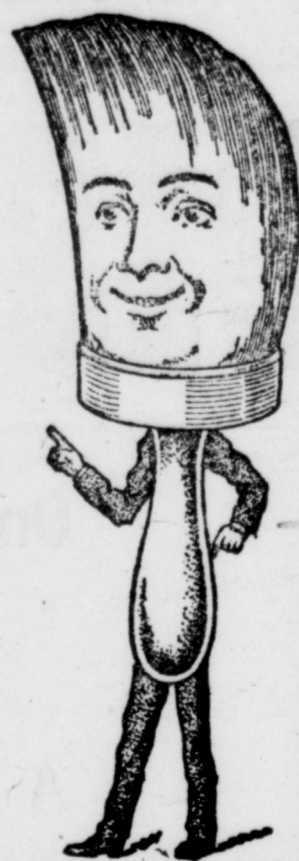

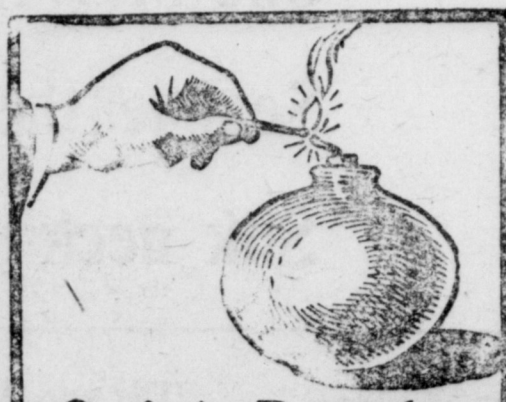
