On June 5th Inspector Colpitts, Constable Woolverton, Holyoke and John Carpenter of Bloomfield, with a search warrant, made a search at the boundary line at Bloomfield, on the premises cc cupied by Charles Wright formerly of the Aberdeen Hotel in Woodstock. Wright was found there occupying a , hut on the American side of the line, but no liquor was found on the Province side.

About 12 o'clock on the night of the 13th inst. the Inspector got word that Homan McMu lin of Wicklow had gone to Kilburn for a load of liquor.
