Cooking Suggestions

The easiest way to prepare pumpkin for pies is to bake it whole in a moderate oven until it can be pierced with a fork. Then cut it in half and scoop out the pulp, which will need little more cooking before putting it in pie-

When meking juicy pies, moisten the edges with mik or water and rub them till smooth. Then insert two or three small pieces of macaroni in the centre of the pie, The juice bubt1 s up irt, the macarani instead of running into the oven or over the top of the crust.

Ginger Crisps.

Two cupfuls of good molasses, one cupful of sugar, one cupful of butter, one egg, two teaspoonfuls of ground ginger, one teaspoonful of soda, and a little boiling water to dissolve it. Do not mix hard; roll thin, and bake in a quick oven. These are nice and will keep a year, if desired.

Knead bread with the tips of the fingers, and handle it as lightly as possible. When it is rising, be care ful not to jar or knock it in any way, or it may fall and become heavy. Even if it does take a long time, keep it warm (not hot) and let it rise to doublants size in the loaf pans. It pays, every time.

If honey granulates or candies, it may be liquefied by setting the vessel containing it in another yeshot, or it will spoil the color and curled celery and serve at once. flavor, and honey contains the most delicate of all flavors-that Extensive Preparation of the flowers from which it is taken. It may take half a day or more to melt the honey.

Peanut Butter.

Shell and rub the pits in a cloth to take the hulls off, then put them twice through a meat grinder If you have none, chop and then mash them with a potato masher. Salt to taste, and moisten with olive-oil or fresh but'er. If to be kept long, pack this peanut butter in small jars and run melted parafine over the top.

. Molasses Doughnuts

Two eggs, well beaten, 1-2 cup sugar, 1.2 cup molasses, 1 cup sour milk, 1 teaspoon soda (rounding full), I teaspoon cream of tirtar (rounding full), mixing spoon melced butter, 1-2 teaspoon ginger 1-2 teaspoon cinnamon. Mix as soft as can be handled without sticking. Cut in strips and twist,

Stewed Fruit.

To stew fruit make a rather thick syrup with half a pound of loaf sugar and a gill of water to every pound of fruit. Prepare the fruit and lay it in the stewing jar. If apples, core them, and if pears cut in half and core. Pour the boiling syrup over it, and cook in a moderate oven on the top of the browning shelf till the fruit is tender. Apples should be stewed whole; apricots and peaches are, like pears, cut in half and the stones removed. To ascer tain if apples or pears are cooked, run a straw through them, or a very fine wooden skewer. For a good luncheon, sweet, stew apples in this manner and stuff them with a mixture of stoned raisins cut in four, srange marmalade and crystallized ginger cut in dice. Add cloves to pears and color with cochineal Stewing pears must be used, as ripe pears will not color preperly. With apricots and peaches add a few of the

ters very fine. Separate six eggs and beat the yolks and whites very light, the whites until they stand alone. Put three tablespoons of butter in a frying pan to heat (but not brown), while you prepare the omelette. Stir half a pint of milk in a deep dish with the egg yolks and season with salt and pepper. Then put in a teaspoon of minced parsley and the chopped oysters, beating vigorously as you add them gradually. Add a tablespoon of melted butter and lastly the white of the eggs. Turn into the buttered pan, Do not stir, but when it begins to set, slip a broad-bladed knife around the sides and under the omelette, so that the butter may reach every part. As soon as the centre is "set," turn it out upside down on a very hot buttered platsel containing hot water; not too ter. Garnish quickly with parsley and

For Parcel Post Service

MONTREAL, Nov. 3. - Preparations are under way, and on a very extensive scale, to establish the new government parcel post service in Montreal and eastern Canada. The service, which goes into effect on January 1, 1914, is expected to be as fully taken advantage of as was that of the United States, and on the basis of the United States figures, Montrea will probably be a clearing house for fifteen million parcels inside the first three months of the year.

Simultaneously with the parcel post service establishment here, other cities under control of Montreal, post office authorities are also being looked after and will have branch departments of the parcel. The cities thus brought directly the Montreal district in parcel post jurisdictions are: St. Hyacinthe, Nicolet, Shebrooke, Quebec, Campbellton, Bathurst, Frederiction, Charlottetown, Chatham, Moncton, St. John, New Glasgow, Truro, Yarmouth, Sydney and Halifax.
