**CLEANING CARPETS,**

If the carpets are only stained in spots, having grease spilled on them sweep thoroughly, then sprinkle potter's clay very thickly over the grease spots, cover with a soft brown paper and set a quite warm flat-iron on the paper over the spot; repeat until all the grease is drawn out.

If the carpet requires cleaning all over, take up, suck the dust out of it, spread on a clean floor and rub over the breadth, a small space at a time, raw grated potatoes using a new broom to rub the pulp on them. Let the carpet dry before using it.

**REMOVING OLD VARNISH**

To remove old varnish from furniture or wall, scrub the surface with a strong solution of sal soda; to each pint of water add enough common washing soda to equal the size of a hen's egg; heat it and apply to the surface while warm. Moisten the varnished surface with this, let stand a few minutes, and the varnish will be easily removed with a scrubbing brush. If scrubbed thoroughly, all foreign matter will be removed from the wood, and it must then be well rinsed with clean water. After thorough drying, it may be painted, stained, or re-varnished.

For removing stains that have been applied to new wood, the surface of the wood must be sandpapered, or planed off.

There is nothing easy about renovating old furniture, because of the much and vigorous rubbing necessary to bring out the polish.

**SCENT AND THE SICK ROOM.**

To keep the air in a sick room fresh and sweet-smelling try burning Eau-de-Cologne in a red-hot spoon. This imparts a delightful fragrance, which is refreshing to the patient.

**TO WHITEN RED HANDS.**

To whiten hands which have become red, rub with strained lemon juice. Allow the juice to dry on, then wash the hands with warm water and oatmeal instead of soap. This will make them white and soft.

**TO REMOVE GRIME FROM HANDS AFTER GARDENING.**

To remove the grime and seams which gardening leaves on the hands, first use a coating of lard, working the hands together as you would using soap; then wash with quite warm water and a good soap rinsing well to remove the soap. When clean, put a few drops of glycerine and lemon juice in the palms and rub over the hands, letting it dry on.

**CARE OF THE HAIR.**

This is recommended for cleaning grey hair: Put a thin cloth over the cat side of a large lemon and rub this thoroughly over the hair and scalp. Then wash in tepid water to remove the dirt and dandruff. It is possible that with dark hair this will be bleaching, but for already grey hair the treatment gives a lovely gloss and is not injurious.

Soaking a switch in a solution of equal parts of peroxide of hydrogen and water will bleach it. Wash the switch in the fluid and spread out to dry; if not bleached enough, repeat the process a few times until the right effect is produced.

**The Peace Of Europe Is Involved by Scutari's Fall.**

Berlin, April 23.—The fall of Scutari has caused the gravest anxiety in political circles here, which fear that it will ultimately involve the peace of Europe. It is semi-officially announced today that the capture of the Turkish

fortress cannot in the slightest degree alter the decision of the European powers to incorporate Scutari in the future state of Albania. There is, however, little expectation here either that the Montenegrins will withdraw peacefully from Scutari or that the unity of the powers will stand the test of an attempt to oust them forcibly, either by means of an international expedition or by Austria and Italy acting as the mandatories of Europe.

**Spoils of War Taken By The Montenegrins.**

CETTINJE, April 22.—The spoils of war taken by the Montenegrins when they entered Scutari included forty-six quick firing cannons and twelve Howitzers with a number of heavy siege guns.
