**TO KEEP CHEESE MOIST.**  
Wrap cheese in a cloth soaked  
in vinegar. This will keep the  
cheese moist and prevent it from  
molding.

**A FINE TEXTURE IN CAKE.**  
The usual cause of cake being  
coarse-grained is lack of suffi-  
cient beating when in the dough  
state. Much beating gives the  
dough a fine, close texture, and  
when insufficiently beaten, the  
texture is coarse and porous.

**Egg With Whipped Cream**  
When whipping cream, add  
the white of one egg to each  
cupful of cream. It will be firm-  
er in consistency, and double in  
quantity. Whip the egg and  
cream separately and then the  
two together.

**Peeling Apples For Pies.**  
Before peeling apples for pies  
it is a good plan to place them  
in the oven for a few minutes,  
as this facilitates the removal  
of the skin. Hot water should  
first be poured over them. They  
should then be drained and plac-  
ed on the top shelf of the oven  
for a few minutes, the door be-  
ing left ajar. At the end of this  
time the apples should be re-  
moved and the skin slightly par-  
ed off with a sharp knife, when  
there will be much less waste  
than if they were peeled in the  
ordinary manner.

**Eggless Cake**  
Two cupfuls of sugar, one-  
half cupful of fresh lard or but-  
ter, four cupfuls of flour, two  
cupfuls of buttermilk, two tea-  
spoonfuls of cinnamon, one-quar-  
ter teaspoonful of allspice, one  
teaspoonful of nutmeg, one  
pound of raisins, seeded and cut,  
one tablespoonful baking powder  
dissolved in one teaspoonful of  
boiling water. Flavor with van-  
illa and orange, blended.

**Cinnamon Loaf Cake.**  
Although this member of the  
cake family may not be rich,  
it at least never causes indig-  
estion. It requires one table-  
spoonful of shortening, creamed  
with one cupful sugar, one egg,  
three-quarters of a cupful of  
sweet milk, one heaping cupful  
of flour with which has been  
mixed one heaping teaspoonful  
of baking powder and one of  
cinnamon.

flour, one-half cupful of cold  
water, one teaspoonful cream of  
tartar, one-half teaspoonful of  
soda. Bake in a quick oven in  
two layers

**Cream Filling for Sponge Cake.**

One pint of sweet milk, put  
on to boil; two eggs, one-half  
cupful of sugar, one heaping  
tablespoonful of flour. Beat  
these last three well together.  
Just as the milk comes to a boil  
stir in one tablespoonful of but-  
ter and then the above mixture.  
Stir constantly until the cream  
thickens like mush. When cold,  
flavor to taste. Split the layers  
and fill.

**Flour Mill For New Brunswick  
Planned**

Plans for stimulating the growth of  
wheat and also for supply cheap by-  
products for feeding live stock are be-  
ing considered by the local government  
The production of wheat in New Brun-  
swick has fallen off during the last few  
years from more than 400,000 bushels to  
about half that quantity.  
The scheme suggested is the establish-  
ment of a modern flour mill in the pro-  
vince to afford a market for the wheat

without heavy transportation charges.  
The by-products of the flour are used  
for live stock food.

An Ontario miller has been brought  
to the province to look over the field and  
pass judgement on its possibilities. To  
the Times to-day he said the samples of  
wheat shown him were of such high  
grade that he would have no hesitation  
in undertaking its milling provided there  
were sufficient quantities of the same  
grade. He would not recommend the  
erection of a mill of a capacity of more  
than 500 barrels and this would require  
an annual production of at least 500,000  
bushels of wheat. Some assistance  
might be required for the mill for the  
first few years, but he did not think it  
would long be needed.—St. John Times  
—Star.
