HOUSEHOLD.

Chocolate Popcorn.
Two cupfuls of white sugar,
one-half cup of corn syrup, two
ounces of chocolate, one cup of
water. Put these ingredients into
a kettle and cook them until the
syrup hardens when put in cold
water. Pour over four quarts of
crisp, freshly popped corn and stir
well to insure the uniform coat-
ing of the kernels.

Codfish.
Broiled salt codfish is very sim-
ple but savory. Soak boneless
codfish over night, drain and dry,
cut into neat squares, rub with but-
ter and broil quickly. Serve with
melted butter and lemon juice.

Coffee Filling.
Make a cupful of strong coffee,
Mocha and Java mixed; add to
this a little less than a table-spoon-
ful of cream and half a cup of
sugar. Blend two heaping tea-
spoonfuls of cornstarch with a
little of the cold coffee, bring the
remainder to the boil, and stir in
the cornstarch. Have two eggs
beaten in a bowl. When the cof-
fee has boiled three minutes, stir-
ring all the while, pour it grad-
ually upon the eggs, stirring brisk-
ly. If not quite thick enough set
over boiling water on the fire and
stir until the egg sets a little, but
be careful not to boil or it will
curdle. Plain custard filling may
be made as above, using milk in
place of coffee.

Deep-Dish Pie.
Line the sides only of a deep
pie or pudding-dish with good
flaky pie-crust. Fill the dish with
any good canned fruit you have,
draining off a little of the juice if
there is too much. Cover with a
good thick crust, nicking the
edges neatly and bake. Serve either
hot or cold with cream or boiled
custard

Scotch Short Bread
Rub together with the fingers 3
tablespoonfuls of sugar, 5 of but-
ter and 7 of flour until evenly
mixed. Press it out about one-half
inch thick in a square tin. Bake it
in a very slow oven for about an
hour. It should be a delicate brown.
Cut it into pieces for serving while
still warm.

**To Conserve Lobster
Fisheries of Island**

Charlottetown, P. E. I., Dec.
4.—A meeting of lobster packers
of the Island was held Wednesday,
the outcome of a smaller meeting
held previously at which a com-
mittee was appointed to consider
the best possible means of con-
serving the industry. Mr. Andrew
King, of Halifax, was appointed
chairman. Though unanimously
concurring that lobster packers
should make greater efforts to co-
operate in the conservation of the
lobster, the feeling of the meeting
was that it was not possible to a-
gree within the short time at its
disposal on suggestions applicable
for P. E. Island packers. A com-
mittee of ten representative men
of the two counties were appointed
to interview all interested parties
on the subject.
