HOUSEHOLD.

POTATO SCONES
 Put two cupfuls of mashed potatoes
 into a bowl, add two tablespoonfuls of
 hot milk, one tablespoonful of melted
 butter one teaspoonful of sugar, a quar-
 ter of a teaspoonful of salt, and one cup-
 ful of flour. Knead, divide into three
 pieces and roll out into rounds. Divide
 each round into four small scones. Place
 them on a hot griddle and cook for
 five minutes on each side. Serve hot
 with butter. These scones may be made
 with left-over potatoes, but are nicer
 if prepared with potatoes freshly boil-
 ed. They will not keep more than a
 day.

Divinity Fudge.
 Two cups white sugar, one cup
 corn syrup, butter size of an egg.
 Cook until it hair; then stir in
 slowly white of an egg stiffly beat-
 en. Add a cup of walnut meat,
 chopped fine, and pour in a but-
 tered pan to cool. This is much
 better the second day.

Superlative Chocolate Candy
 One and one-half pounds gran-
 ulated sugar, one-fourth pound
 chocolate, one-fourth pound
 butter, one cup milk. Put all in a
 stew pan and let boil. Try a tbl.
 in cold water, and when it separ-
 ates in the water take it off the
 stove and beat until thick. Pour
 into a buttered pan.

In making mayonnaise, add a
 pinch of soda to the vinegar and
 you never will be troubled by the
 curdling of the dressing when cook-
 ing.

TO KEEP FOOD HOT
 To keep a dish of food hot for
 half an hour or longer, a better
 plan than putting it in the oven
 is to set it in a saucepan of boiling
 water, letting the saucepan stand
 on the top of the stove.

TO CLEAN VELVET FLOWERS.
 It is said that dry bran is an
 excellent cleanser for dainty vel-
 vet flowers and woolen fabrics.
 Rub the solid spots harder than
 the rest, then rub or wash it
 off.

Clover is a cheap food for hogs
 in summer, and alfalfa is best of
 all.

Clean up the orchard now and
 have it in nice shape for work early
 in the spring.

Fat loaded on the young horse
 is simply wasted money: not so
 with cattle, sheep and hogs.

Get the air hole in the pump
 ready before the frosts come.
 Many a cold day's work might
 be avoided by a little care before-
 hand.

Better get the wood under the
 shed before it is soaked with the
 fall rains. It can be worked up
 during stormy days when nothing
 else can be done.

There is no better feed for young
 ducks than bits of food from the
 kitchen. They are, perhaps, the
 best balanced food that can be
 obtained for all kinds of fowl.

In choosing a male bird, size
 and shape should be given special
 consideration. He should possess
 a large frame, be clean and tall on
 the legs and active in habits.
