CENTRAL AMERICA

Bogota, Columbia, April 11.—Much alarm has been caused here by reports published in the papers that bubonic plague has broken at the seaport of Santa Marta and is increasing.

Steamship France Will Dock
This Afternoon

NEW YORK, April 11.—The steamship France, bearing the body of the late J. P. Morgan, passed Nantucket Lightship at four o'clock this morning and was expected to dock about 3.30 o'clock this afternoon. The body will be immediately removed from the ship and taken under strong police guard to the Morgan library, where it will rest until Monday morning, when funeral services will be held in St. George's church. It will then be conveyed by special train to Hartford, Conn., and placed in the family mausoleum.

Statements printed in New York show that since 1870 the death rate has fallen from 27.39 a year a thousand of the population to 14.11 a thousand. Of the world's great cities only London with a death rate of 13.52 a thousand made a better showing in 1912. Berlin, where the regulation of the citizens' movements is carried to the extreme, has a death rate of 14.39 a thousand, and Paris one of 16.38. It is doubtful if in any case the improvement in the time stated has been as great as in New York, where the rate has been cut down almost one-half.

Capt. Amundsen confirms the report that he will use hydro-aeroplanes on his next North Pole expedition, and is glad the United States will permit the Fram to be the first vessel except a warship through the Panama Canal.

GREAT STRIKE IN
BELGIUM

LIEGE, Belgium, April 15.—The number of men who stopped work in the mines and factories in the vicinity was greater to-day than yesterday.

ANTWERP, April 15.—Work was more general in the northern sections of this seaport to-day. In the other parts of the city, the situation was unchanged, the strike generally being only partial.

BRUSSELS, April 15.—The suspension of work in the manufacturing suburbs of the Belgian capital was to-day on about the same scale as yesterday. The usually crowded workmen's trains in the early morning ran half empty to-day.

CHARLEROI, Belgium, April 15.—The strike greatly extended here today. Not a minor is working, and nearly all the metal workers have laid down their tools.

BRUSSELS, April 15.—Over a third of the total number of workmen in Belgium have struck work and joined in the Socialist protest against the system of plural voting which effectually prevents them from obtaining a majority at the polls and which has permitted the Clerical party to remain in power for the past twenty years. Virtually complete figures gathered from all the provinces except Antwerp West Flanders show that there was a total of 256,000 strikers this morning and the estimates from Antwerp and

West Flanders, where the Socialists are weakest, indicate that there are another 14,000 strikers there, making in all 270,000 men who have quit work in the entire country. The Socialists, however, assert that the total reaches 350,000, while the Clerical and the government say they number only 120,000. Despite the fact that so many of the laboring classes are idle there has been a notable lack of violence.

CONSTANTINOPLE, April 15.—A persistent report is in circulation here that a ten days' armistice, beginning at six o'clock yesterday evening, has been concluded between Turkey and Bulgaria. PARIS, April 15.—A three day armistice has been arranged between Turkey and the Balkan allies, according to semi-official despatches from Constantinople.

RADIUM TO CURE CANCER.

PHILADELPHIA, April 2.—Physicians in this city will watch with interest the result of injection of one three-hundredths of an ounce of radium into the liver of Malcom Watson, as a cure for cancer.

The operation was performed yesterday in the Methodist Episcopal Hospital by Dr. G. J. Schwartz. The radium was brought to Philadelphia by Dr. Otto Arill, an Austrian chemist, now living in Pittsburgh.

The dose put into Watson's liver was worth just \$2,500. It is believed that the radium rays will act on the cancer as they do on a number of diseases and gradually kill it. Several prominent medical men witnessed the operation. The only anesthetic used was a local application of cocaine.

Would Make The Millionaires Pay.

WASHINGTON, April 8.—An inheritance tax that would run as high as fifty per cent on fortunes of over \$15,000,000 was proposed in a bill introduced in the Senate to-day by Senator Jones, of Washington. The measure would impose inheritance tax on all estates except where the bequest is to members of the immediate family, in which case there would be an exemption of \$25,000 and a reduced tax rate.

The general inheritance tax proposed is as follows:

On estates of less than \$5,000, one per cent.

From \$5,000 to \$50,000, two per cent.

From \$50,000 to \$250,000, five per cent.

From \$250,000 to \$750,000, ten per cent.

From \$750,000 to \$1,500,000, fifteen per cent.

From \$1,500,000 to \$3,000,000, twenty per cent.

From \$3,000,000 to \$7,000,000, twenty-five per cent.

From \$7,000,000 to \$15,000,000, forty per cent.

Above \$15,000,000, fifty per cent.

No constitutional amendment would be necessary to impose an inheritance tax.

In the House a similar bill to that of Senator Jones was introduced by Representative La Follette, and referred to the Ways and Means Committee. Representative Miller, of Kansas, also introduced a bill to provide for a taxation of inheritance devices, legacies and gifts in the District of Columbia in excess of \$3,000.

Wireless for Explorers.

Anti-Noise Crusade In
German Capital.

Berlin, April 12.—Residents and sojourners in the German capital heretofore have found it difficult enough to go about their everyday business without violating some of the thousand and one municipal laws and regulations, but this difficulty is likely to be increased several fold by the batch of new police regulations that is to come into force to-morrow. These regulations were drawn up with the evident purpose of making the streets quieter and cleaner. They include the following:

No whistling, singing, shouting or loud talking of any kind likely to endanger the quiet of the streets is to be permitted; no paper, remains of fruits, cigars and cigarettes may be thrown into streets; the dragging of women's dresses is prohibited; persons with umbrellas or canes must not carry or swing them in any manner likely to imperil the safety of passers by, and, finally, no windows or doors of houses, flats, shops or restaurants in which music is being played may be kept open.

Clean Telephones
To keep telephones clean a San Francisco inventor has patented a machine that automatically covers a transmitter with paper after it has been used, which paper must be removed before the instrument is used again.
