**Household.**  
BAKED ONIONS.

Onions are excellent baked.  
Take the onions as near round in  
size as may be, remove the brown  
skin, cook first for ten minutes  
in clear boiling water; drain this  
off, and dry the onions with a  
clean cloth, and lay in a baking  
pan; sprinkle pepper and salt over  
them, and add a little hot milk.  
Bake until done and brown, then,  
put into a hot dish or dishes, put  
bits of butter over each, and eat  
 piping hot, with plain bread and  
butter. This is excellent for cold.  
The Spanish onion is a wet and  
much liked for eating.

If raw onions are liked, slice and  
lay in a dish; pour boiling water  
over them, let stand for a few min-  
utes, then pour the water off, and  
chill before serving. This will re-  
move much of the sharp taste.

**OLD ENGLISH BARLEY-SUGAR CANDY.**

Pour one pint of hot water over  
one and one-half pounds of lump  
sugar in a saucepan, and let it  
stand fifteen minutes. Then put  
it over the fire and let it boil.  
When a little of it becomes hard  
and brittle on being dropped into  
cold water, add the juice of a lemon  
and one-half tea-spoonful of lemon  
extract. Allow the mixture to  
boil up, then set the pan in a dish  
containing cold water to reduce the  
temperature. When the syrup is  
cool, pour it into a buttered or oil-  
ed pan. Draw together with a  
knife to keep it from spreading.  
When it is cool enough to handle,  
cut off small pieces, roll or twist  
them, and dip them into sifted or  
powdered sugar.

**Will consider Plans to Fare-  
stall Floods**

ST. LOUIS, Mo., April 10.—With  
hundreds of delegates present from  
all parts of the country, representing  
state and municipal governments,  
commercial and improvement bodies,  
and development and conservation or-  
ganizations, the third annual meeting  
of the National Drainage Congress  
opened here to-day. The session will  
continue until Saturday, and during  
that time much important action is  
expected to be taken looking toward  
the protection, by levee construction  
and other means, of the life and health  
of the people from floods, storms and  
tides, and the reclamation of the 75,000-  
000 acres of swamp and overflowed lands  
in the United States, and their utiliza-  
tion for agricultural purposes.

Not since the beginning of the move-  
ment looking toward government aid  
in a vast scheme of drainage the swamps  
lands of the country has so much interest  
been taken in the meetings of the drain-  
age congress and during the three days'  
session drainage and its kindred sub-  
jects, irrigation, forestry and water-  
ways improvement, will not only be  
discussed but practical illustrations of  
what drainage is doing for various sec-

**A Dastardly Attempt  
At Train Wrecking**

MONCTON, N. B., April 12.—Further  
investigation into the run-off near Ar-  
rherst, Thursday show that it was a most  
dastardly attempt at train-wrecking.  
Not only was the switch turned to run  
the Springhill local into a siding, but a  
lamp was ripped off and thrown away  
so that the engineer would be deceived  
into believing he had not yet arrived at  
the siding.

Members of the auxiliary crew found  
the lamp near the switch yesterday. Or-  
ly the fact that the run off occurred at  
the top of a steep grade where the train  
was making only fair speed prevented  
the wreck from having much more se-  
rious consequences than it did. As he  
felt the front trucks strike the ties, En-  
gineer Cook applied the air-brakes and  
closed the throttle—a strong factor in  
accounting for life and preventing great  
damage. There is intense indignation  
among railway men, and the I. C. R.  
authorities are urged to make every  
possible effort to bring the perpetrators  
to justice. It has been about sixteen  
years since a successful attempt has  
been made to wreck an I. C. R. train.  
That time the train was wrecked near  
Bellevue by a sleeper across the rails.  
The guilty parties were captured by  
Detective Skeffington and got three  
years each in Dorchester.

Washington, April 9.—The National  
Geographical Society today announce-  
ed that it had voted \$20,000 to the  
Norwegian Polar expedition, which  
will leave the Pacific coast under  
command of Captain Roland Amund-  
sen, in June, 1914, to explore the  
Polar basin. The vast track lying be-  
tween the northern shores of Canada  
and Alaska and the Asiatic coast is  
Captain Amundsen's objective terri-  
tory, but he expects also to attain the  
North Pole. The voyage, it is said,  
will require four years drifting in the  
Polar ice.
