HOUSEHOLD.

Grape Lemonade.

To one quart of lemonade, made rather sweet, add a tumber of pure grape juice. Delicious.

Cookie Filling.

One cup cocked prunes, chopped half cup prune syrup, one heaping tablespoon currants, one teaspoon flour. Cook until it thickens (use brown sugar when cooking prunes)

Apple Butter.

Use sweet apples, or partly sweet, place in a large kettle and cover with just enough water to tew; when soft, remove from kettle and run through a ccl ander to extract the pulp; return to the kettle and add a bottle of boiled cider and sugar to taste. Boil, st rring constantly, and when scum arises to the top and it is about as thick as marmalade, remove from the stove and place in crocke, keeping in a cool, dry place. The top can be covered with a liyer of a afine. In peach butter omit the cider and use about one-balf sugar.

Salad Filling For Sandwiches.

Mix one cupful of whipped cream, a pinch of salt, a little lemon juice and one-half cupful of nut meats. Spread between thin slices of bread.

Another good salad filling can be made of one-half cupful of chopped celery leaves, a bit of pepper, a slice of tomato and mayonnaise. Mix celery leaves with the mayonnaise and spread on the tomato, placing between all ces of bread.

IMPROVEMENT IN 40 YEARS

Deplorable as the condition of the poorer classes in England still is, there has, nevertheless, been a vast improvement in the life of the present generation. In the past forty years, the Westminster Gazette says, pauperism has been reduced by one half. When the figures were first complied in 1872, the number of paupers was 42 per thousand. On January 1 of this year it was 21.7 per thousand Since 1910 the effect of Old-Age Pensions in saving the aged from pauper relief has been gradually increasing. Pensions have not taken many of the very old from the workhouses, but they have prev n'ed many more from entering them.

SWITZERLAND'S WATCH IN-DUSTRY.

Switz rland exported 11,529,316 watches last year with a total value of \$5,512,000. Of the watthes exported 7,112,803 were nickel, 3,346,637 silver and 1,069,876 gold. Of those exported 2,647,800 went to the United Kingdom, 1,696,000 to Germany, and 739,400 to Inda. Canada, was amongst the the smaller purchasers, taking 50,000. The population of Switzerland, is only a little over 3 3-4 millions,

A Necessary Food Supply

Some comparisons of records indicate what infinitely better returns some dairy men obtain from their cows than do other owners of herds. One lot of milk testin; 3,4, delivered at a factory lut month was 21,580 pounds, the yield of 20 cows in two herds. Two other herds also totaling 20 cows and producing 3.4 milk gave orly 12,-380 pounds during the same month. These are not extreme comparisons because in many cases the test was lower and the total rounds of fat delivered would be consequently far lower. Apart however from the weight of fat and the monetary value of the milk, think of one group of 20 cows giving in one month four and a half tons o' milk more than the other gorup.

It needs no stretch of imagination to picture the consternation there would be if Canadian cows in general were as poor as these twenty Outario cows: people need mik, plenty of it, as a good, nutritious and cheap food in these days of high prices. But if por cows with only low yields are k pt, where would be this necessary and universally appreciated food supply

Fortunately, through systematic cow testing, these comparisons are possible, so that an incentive is furnished to every owner of a poor herd to keep cows more worthy the name of 'dairy cows. Simple records, easily kept, give definite information acting as guide posts to herds bred and fed for large yields.
