CRANBERRIES FOR THE  
TURKEY.

Tradition makes the cranberry  
the proper accompaniment of tur-  
key and our taste endorses it. Cran-  
berries are considered one of the  
most healthful of fruits. Eaten raw  
they are said to be an excellent  
remedy for indigestion and bil-  
iousness, as they contain acid  
properties not present in most  
fruits. Eaten freely after typhoid  
fever they are said to clear the  
system. They are also an excel-  
lent appetizer and tonic. Never use  
tin or iron ware in cooking cran-  
berries, as the acid of the berry,  
like the tomato, will be affected by  
the combination.

JELLIED CRANBERRIES

When cranberries are tender,  
as they are apt to be at this sea-  
son, there is no better way of  
cooking them than this: Wash  
and look over the berries, re-  
moving any that are soft or im-  
perfect. Put into a porcelain or  
granite kettle that has not chip-  
ped and sprinkle over them  
half as much sugar as you have  
berries. On top of the sugar  
crust pour gently half as much  
water as you have sugar. Thus,  
if you are cooking a quart of  
cranberries, you would use a  
pint of sugar and a half pint or  
one cupful of water. Cook very  
slowly. When they break into a  
boil, cover just a few moments,  
but not long, as you do not wish  
the skins to burst. Then uncover  
and cook gently until tender.  
Pour into a mold. When cold the  
juice will be firm, inclosing the  
berries which will be soft but  
retain their form.

Sometimes cranberries in the  
market are not all the house-  
wife could wish, but a bit of  
of baking-soda removes much of  
the sauce or jelly. Sort a quart of  
berries carefully, discarding all  
soft ones, as they impair the  
flavor; wash them, and cover  
with cold water. Add half a level  
teaspoonful of soda, and bring  
quickly to the boiling-point.  
Watch carefully, and as soon as  
the berries begin to pop open,  
pour off the dark-colored water  
and cover again with fresh  
water. Cook till all the berries  
are soft, rub through a coarse  
sieve to remove the tough skins.  
Add as much sugar as you have  
berry-pulp and cook together  
about five minutes. Pour into a  
mold to cool.

A CHEAP CRANBERRY  
JELLY.

Run the berries, after wash-  
ing and sorting, through the  
meat-chopper, add the usual pro-  
portions of water, cook until  
thoroughly soft, add heated  
sugar and cook till it jellies. Ab-  
solutely nothing is wasted. The  
bits of skin are not perceptible,  
and the jelly is delicious.

EXETER CAKE.

One egg, one cup sugar, half  
cup butter, half cup molasses,  
one cup sour milk, two and a  
half cups flour, one cup raisins,  
two-thirds teaspoon soda, cassia,  
cloves, nutmeg, and little mace.  
Two small loaves or one large  
one.

ENGLISH CHUTNEY.

Six large green apples, three-  
quarter pound of seeded raisins,  
two red peppers, three moderate  
sized onions, two tablespoons of  
mustard seed, one-half cup of salt,  
one pound of brown sugar, three  
pints of vinegar, ten ripe tomatoes.  
Chop fine the apples (pared and  
cored) the tomatoes, onions and  
peppers, the latter having had the  
seeds removed. Place these in an  
opened-mouthed jar or sugar, and  
add the spices, raisins, sugar and  
vinegar, the latter having been  
scalded and cooled. Leave for ten  
days, stirring every day; then set  
aside in a cool place until needed  
for use.

For something new and dainty,  
spread the buttered fudge pan  
with minced dates before turning  
the candy into it.
