**TO SHOW SECURITY IN AN**  
**AEROPLANE.**

Paris, Sept., 3—M. Pegoud, the

## HOUSEHOLD.

### THE CUCUMBER SEASON.

**Stewed Cucumbers.**—Try stewed cucumbers in the Italian style. Parboil two small cucumbers: peel and cut into halves. Remove the seed, then cut into small even pieces. Put in a pan; add a pint of milk, two ounces of butter, a dessert spoonful of finely chopped onion, white pepper and salt to taste, and half a teaspoonful of grated nutmeg. Stew slowly until the cucumber is soft, stirring frequently and adding more milk if required. Put in a hot dish, pouring the milk over it.

**Sweet Cucumber Pickles.**—Let the cucumbers stand in salt water three days. Heat the brine once or twice and pour over them. Drain; put in a jar and pour over them hot vinegar with cloves and cinnamon in a bag; two thirds cupfuls sugar to quart of vinegar put in plenty of horseradish and this will keep sealed or open. Put in a little alum to make them brittle.

**Boiled Sweet Cucumber Pickles.**—Put cucumbers in cold weak brine (1 1-2 cup salt to one gallon water) one day and night. Take out dry on a cloth. To one gallon vinegar add two cups sugar, nearly one ounce mixed spice. Heat these all boiling hot. Put in pickles and let boil up once. Put in cans immediately and pour the hot vinegar over them. They are nice and sweet, and will keep a long time, till eaten. These will not shrivel if you follow directions. One gallon vinegar will cover two gallons cucumbers.

**Steamed Sweet Cucumber Pickles.**—Peel, steam as soft as liked and let stand over night in a weak brine. Next morning drain, put on vinegar enough to cover, and let stand over night. Again in the morning drain off the liquid part. Now take one pint of fresh vinegar, three pounds of sugar and one ounce cassia buds (no other spices). When this comes to the boiling point put in the cucumbers let scald up and then pack away in stone jars.

**Mustard Pickles.**—Two quart small cucumbers, one quart small onions, one quart green tomatoes, one large cauliflower, six green peppers, quartered. Lay in weak brine 24 hours, then scald in same water and drain. Paste—six table-spoonfuls turmeric, 1 1-2 cup of sugar, one small cup of flour, two quarts best cider vinegar. Mix dry ingredients thoroughly, add vinegar, boil a few minutes, pour over pickles and bottle.

Except for very young animals skim-milk gives the best returns when used in combination with other foods, generally grains.

The centres of trees whose wood is decayed should be cleaned and filled. Prevention of cavities is preferable and by far the cheapest. A tree is well worth good care.

Carrots are excellent food for hogs, either in summer or winter. Mineral matter is an essential. A pig fed on ground corn and water and provided with plenty of mineral matter will gain twice as much as one fed on ground corn and water alone.

lice. Little chicks cannot do well when bothered by these pests. Apply olive oil to the chick's head. This is better than lard as too much lard on a chick's body will kill it.

The plowing in of green manure crops is one of the most effective methods of enriching the surface soil. Green crops contain elements of fertility derived from the air and from the mineral and vegetable constituents of the subsoil on which they grow, as well as what they have taken from the surface soil.

Crops grown upon clean land are more valuable than those grown upon foul land. Weeds rob the cultivated plant of the food which has been placed in the soil for its benefit. This is the first reason why a crop should be hoed—it involves the destruction of weeds.

Exchange: Based upon recent discoveries connected with the application of new chemical formulas, Prof., Alexander Silverman, head of the chemical department of the University of Pittsburgh, announced recently that developments in the glass industry in the future will be as revolutionary as those in the manufacture of steel in the past. "I believe that the chemist will completely revolutionize the manufacture of glass within the next 20 or 25 years," Prof. Silverman said, "and that effects will be produced which have never been dreamed of. At the same time, the cost will be reduced in many cases, and products which at present are wasted will be utilized."
