England out of Panama Exposition

London, Dec. 19 The British press generally expresses regret at last night's decision of the cabinet not to provide for the erection of an official pavilion for the display of their goods at the Panama-Pacific Exposition at San Francisco in 1915.

The Unionist's Evening Standard says the question of expense should not have stood in the way of assisting in the celebration of the completion of a great commercial enterprise by a friendly power.

The Westminster Gazette says: 'We should be sorry for the United States to think the attitude of Great Britain is significant of more than the simple fact that manufacturers have not been attracted by the proposition.'

The committee which has been urging British participation in the exposition will probably organize a parliamentary committee to place the case before the House of Commons when it meets.

PAPER ARTILLERY,

The extent to which paper today takes the place of iron and wood and steel in the manufacture of many articles is surprising. The paper water-pail is now so well known that it no longer seems unusual; paper

wheels for railway cars are common, if less familiar. London Tit Bits describes a project for the most remarkable of all uses of paper as a substitute for steel in a certain kind of cannon.

The famous Krupp works, in Germany, have already manufactured some of these paper cannons. They are field pieces designed for the special use of infantry. Their caliber is a little less than two inches, and they are so light that a soldier can easily carry one. The advantages of that facility of transportation are, of course, tremendous. And strange as it may seem, the resistance of these paper guns is greater than that of steel field-pieces of the same caliber.

The paper cannon are not intended to supplant those made of steel. They are merely for use in situations where the movement of heavy field-artillery would be impracticable.

Wireless Station Near Completion.

Newcastle, Dec. 19—It is now expected that the wireless station of the Universal Radio Syndicate being erected here will be ready for service about the middle of January. The main steel tower has now reached the height of 300 feet and will be completed inside of the next two weeks. This tower is being erected of hollow steel tubing and each section is twenty feet long. The power house is now about

complete, and all that remains to be done is the plastering and this will not be done until the spring. One of the engines, of which there will be two, has already arrived. It is of the Diesel type using fuel oil. A cooling tower and water storage tank is now being erected. The cooling tower will be used for cooling the water which will be used in the engines. The receiving and sending apparatus is about all in place and preparations are being made for raising the antenna. This is the net-work of copper wire from the wooden towers to the main steel tower and contains upwards of 120,000 feet of bronze wire. Mr. E. W. Sawyer, of Los Angeles, Cal., is superintending the work for the Radio Company.

FIVE COUNTERFEITERS ARRESTED IN QUEBEC.

Montreal, Dec. 19.—The biggest round up of alleged counterfeiters ever effected in Canada, took place today when Dominion Secret Service-man Parkinson and Chief McCaskill, of the Provincial Detective Force, arrested five men, four in Montreal and one at Joliette, Quebec, charged with making bogus ten and hundred dollar United States bills. These bills have been issued in every city of the Dominion and after months of searching Parkinson traced the bulk of them to Montreal, and with the assistance of the provincial officer located at Joliette, one of the most up-to-date counterfeiting plants ever seized. It

was installed in an old shanty in the woods north of the town, and here one of the suspects was seized, while the four others, including an engraver and a well known local artist, were arrested in Montreal. Two other suspects are being looked for and will be arrested by to-night.

Chicago, Dec. 18.—The estate of William Deering, the Harvester manufacturer, estimated at from \$12,000,000 to \$13,000,000, is left to his immediate family. None of the estate was left to charity. Mr. Deering stating in his will he considered he had done enough for charity during his life time. Mr. Deering came from Maine.

Mayor Disappears Of Pool Tables.

Wainwright, Alta., Dec., 18.—Mayor Laity, of Wainwright, has resigned office rather than sign a cheque in payment for a pool table for the local fire brigade of eight men.

Say That Chinamen Are More Reliable

Vancouver, B. C., Dec. 15.—Officials of the Canadian Pacific Railway explained that the reason why a number of Chinese have been substituted for white men as ordinary seamen aboard the Empress of India is that Chinese are much more reliable. On a recent voyage 34 white sailors were signalled, but when they turned up only four were fit for duty. All the others were intoxicated or otherwise incapacitated. Driven to desperation, the company arranged for Chinese to do the rough work, but maintained the white seamen. Almost all of the white men available were roustabouts who did not seriously follow the sea for a living.

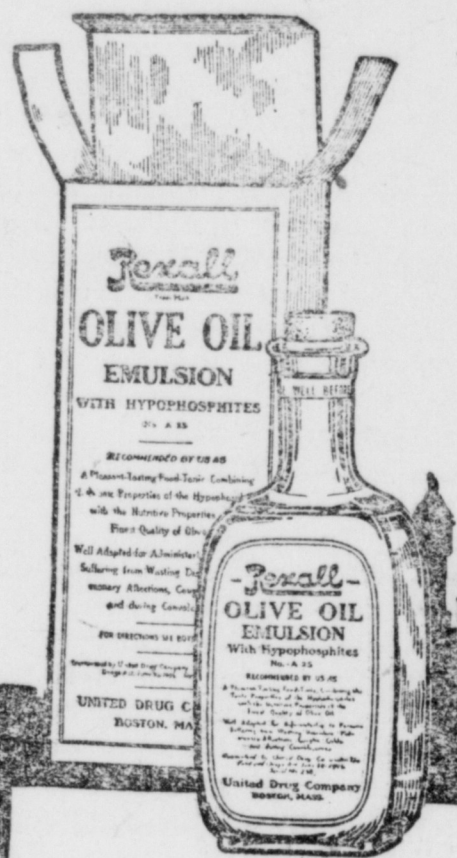

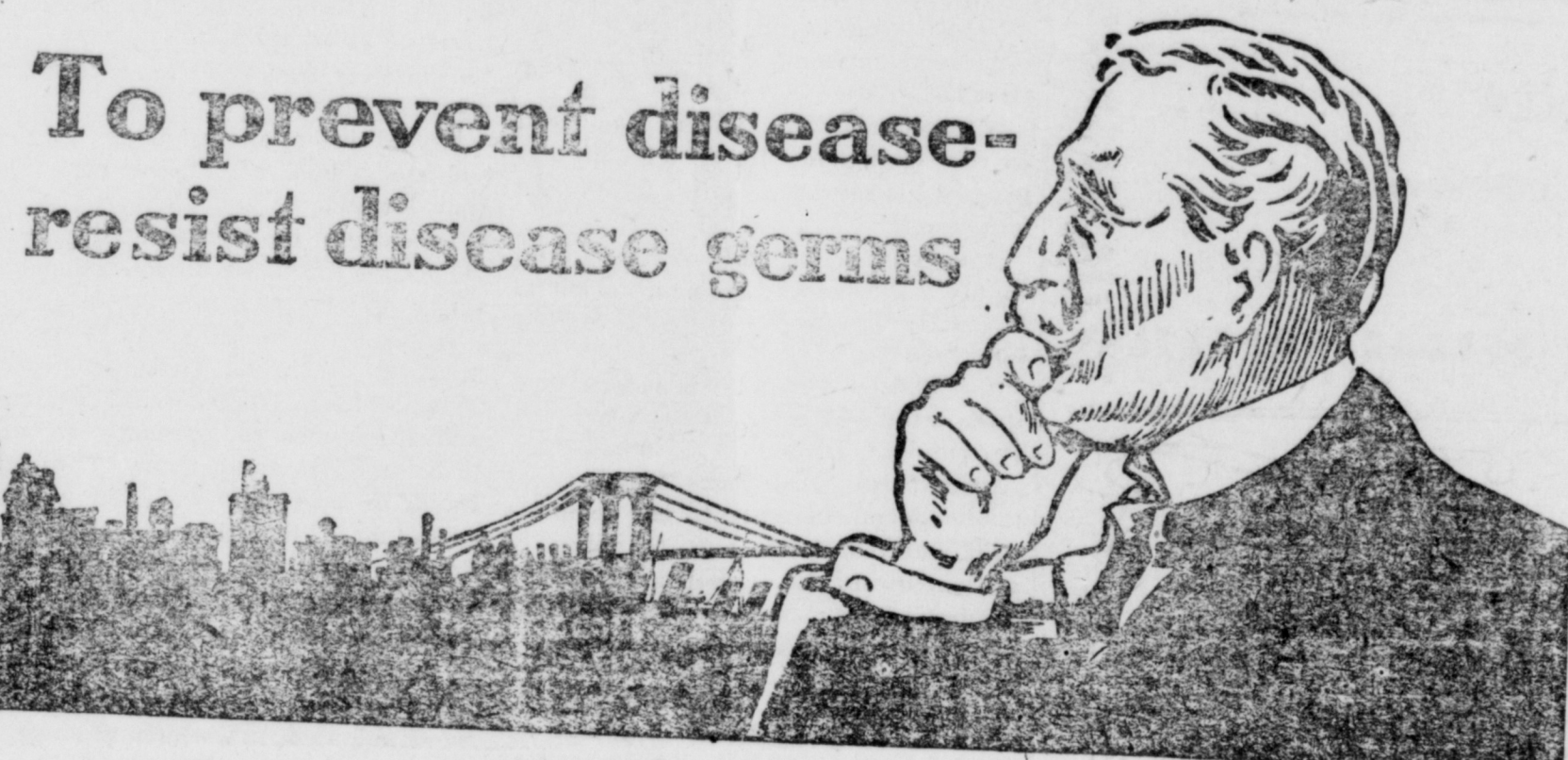
