HOUSEHOLD.

Raisin Cake Filling.
 One cup water, one-quarter cupful
 syrup, two-thirds cupful sug-
 ar, one egg, one cupful raisins.
 Seed and chop raisins. Add sugar,
 syrup and water, and cook till
 raisins are soft. Put over pan of
 water and add egg, slightly beaten
 cook till consistency of thick
 cream. Flavor with lemon. Cool
 before using. This makes an un-
 usually good filling for any plain
 layer cake.

Braised chicken.
 Clean and disjoint chicken and
 roll in flour. Put in deep kettle or
 stewpan enough butter or drippings
 to cover pan about an inch deep.
 When hot, put chicken in and
 brown. Then cover the pan and
 set where the chicken will fry or
 simmer very slowly. An old hen
 can be cooked this way and be
 very tender when done.

Butterscotch Pie.
 Brown one tablespoon butter,
 being careful not to scorch. Add
 two cups milk, three-fourths cup
 brown sugar, yolks of one or two
 eggs, and two tablespoons flour or
 flour and corn-starch mixed which
 has been dissolved with a little of
 the milk. When ingredients are
 well mixed place over the fire until
 the mixture thickens. Have a
 crust baked to a light brown, add
 the filling, and cover with a frost-
 ing made of the beaten whites
 and two tablespoons sugar. Set in
 the oven to brown. A smoother
 crust will be obtained if it is bak-
 ed on an inverted pie tin.

Marshmallows.
 Soak four ounces of pulverized
 gum arabic in a teacup of cold wa-
 ter for two hours. Put into a dou-
 ble boiler with cold water in the
 outer vessel and bring gradually
 to the boiling point. When the
 gum is dissolved, strain through
 coarse muslin, return to the dou-
 ble boiler with a heaping cup of
 powdered sugar and stir steadily
 until the mixture is white and
 stiff. Remove from the fire, beat
 very hard for a minute and flavor
 with vanilla. Beat for a minute
 longer, and pour into tins, the in-
 sides of which have been rubbed
 with cornstarch. When the paste
 is cool, cut it into squares and
 turn each of these over and over
 in a mixture of three parts corn
 starch and one part powdered sug-
 ar.

FERRARA, STRIPPED.

Rome, Jan. 15.—St. Anthony's
 church at Ferrara was stripped of
 practically everything of value
 though the number of exhibits is
 not equal to former years. While
 exhibits are fewer they are consid-
 ered to be of a better quality than
 at preceding shows.

After a fire in the two-story
 frame home of Frank Mitelo, at
 1334 Sixty-sixth street, near
 Thirteenth avenue, in the Home-
 wood section of Brooklyn, had
 been extinguished early on Wed-
 nesday, the firemen found six
 bladders that had been filled with
 turpentine distributed through the
 house and all connected by a fuse
 attached to a time clock. Mitelo
 was arrested.

A cage carrying six miners to
 their work in mine No. 7 of the
 Spencer-Nowlins Coal company,
 Mulberry, Kan., was dropped a
 hundred feet to the bottom of the
 shaft by the breaking of a cable on
 Wednesday, and three of the min-
 ers were killed.
