HOUSEHOLD.

LONGFELLOW CAKE.

This cake is really a white fruit
 cake, and to make it you will need one
 cupful of butter, two cupfuls of sugar,
 one cupful of milk, three cupfuls of
 flour and two teaspoonfuls of baking
 powder, one cupful of seeded raisins,
 one of thinly sliced citron, the whites
 of four eggs and one-half cupful of
 corn starch. Use one teaspoonful each
 of lemon and vanilla for flavoring. Fold
 in the well-beaten whites of the eggs
 last. Bake slowly in a moderate oven.
 cover with a boiled frosting.

VALENTINE CAKE.

One cupful of sugar, one-half cupful
 of butter, one-half cupful of milk, the
 whites of four eggs, one and a half
 cupfuls of flour, two level teaspoon-
 fuls of baking powder, one teaspoonful
 of lemon extract and half a tea-
 spoonful of salt. Cream the butter
 and sugar, add the milk and flavor-
 ing, then the flour, into which has
 been sifted the baking powder and
 salt. Beat the whites of the eggs
 to a stiff froth and add them last,
 folding them in carefully. Bake in
 a sheet tin. Cover the bottom of the
 tin with a thin layer of the cake bat-
 ter, then dot it quite thickly with
 marshmallows and spread the balance
 of the batter carefully over all. Bake
 in a rather quick oven. When cold
 cover with a boiled frosting and decorate
 with pink candy hearts and the figure of
 a cupid, if available.

CREAM PRUNE PIE.

Stew, stone and mash through a
 colander enough prunes to make a
 cup of pulp. To this add a cup of thin
 cream, thickened with a teaspoonful of
 cornstarch, rubbed smooth in a little
 cold milk; the yolks of two well-beaten
 eggs and a third of a cupful of sugar.
 Put in a spoonful or two of apricot or
 other fruit juice left in a can from an-
 other meal. Line in a pie plate with
 pie crust and fill with the mixture and
 bake as quickly as you can without burn-
 ing. Make a meringue with the whites
 and spread over the top of the pie when
 it is done. Brown lightly. Eat cold or
 hot as preferred.

**Fire Maple Sugar and
 Syrup**

In the days of crude sugar bush meth-
 ods there was little opportunity of
 learning the difference between the in-
 ferior dark products and those of fine
 quality, but now consumers are learning
 to appreciate the excellence of superior
 goods and to accept no other so long as
 these are available. This appreciation
 is leading to better returns for those
 who produce the light colour, fine flav-
 oured sugar and syrup.

The up-to-date maple sugar maker
 recognizes that sap, like milk, is a very
 perishable product, being an excellent
 medium for the development of fer-
 mentative organisms. To make a fine
 sugar or syrup it is necessary therefore,
 for the maker to have an equipment
 which will allow for the least possible
 contamination of the product in all stages
 of manufacture. Not only must thorough
 cleanliness be observed but transforma-
 tion of the sap to the finished product
 must be direct and speedy.
 Bulletin No. 2B "Maple Sugar" issued
 a few months ago by the Department
 of Agriculture at Ottawa deals fully
 with this subject and is therefore useful
 to the consumer in making clear what
 constitutes fine products and to the pro-
 ducer in showing how such goods are
 made.

**Arson Squad Burn
 Historic Church.**

Dunbar, Scotland, Feb. 26--An
 "Arson squad" of militant suffrag-
 ets to-day burned to the ground the
 historic parish church of the
 village of White Kirk near here.
 A large quantity of suffrage litera-
 ture was left strewn about the scene.
 The Church was erected in the
 thirteenth century and contained
 many relics of the battle in which
 the Scots were routed by Oliver
 Cromwell's forces in 1650. In the
 vicinity is the famous battle ground
 of Dunbar, where the English to-
 tally defeated the Scots in 1296
 and caused John Balliol to give up
 the crown of Scotland.

London, Feb. 26--Confirmation
 of the statement that no steps were
 being taken by the British govern-
 ment for the expulsion of Miss Z. Lie
 Emerson, the militant suffragette,
 of Jackson, Me., was given by the
 Home Secretary in a printed reply
 to a question put to him in the
 House of Commons to-day.

Mr. McKenna added:

"If Miss Emerson again commits
 an offence bringing her within the
 provisions of the aliens act, the
 question of applying to the court
 for a recommendation for her expul-
 sion will be considered."

The original question also asked
 whether there was any precedent
 for the deportation from the Brit-
 ish Isles of an American citizen as
 an undesirable alien. To this, Mr.
 McKenna replied that 143 Ameri-
 can citizens, convicted of crimes,
 had been ordered expelled from the
 British Isles during the eight years
 since the enactment of the aliens
 act.

Mr. McKenna to-day had an audi-
 ence with King George, it is assum-
 ed in connection with Mrs. Park-
 hurst's application for an interview
 with His Majesty.

The incendiaries apparently had
 sprayed the interior of the church
 with inflammable oil. They also
 used explosives, as several massive
 slabs of stone were shattered.

**Famous Cartoonist Dead, Aged 94
 Years**

London, Feb. 26--Sir John Ten-
 niel, for many decades the leading
 British cartoonist, died to-day at
 the age of ninety-four.

Sir John joined the staff of Lon-
 don Punch in 1851, and retired on-
 ly in 1905--having given fifty
 year's service. He was a member
 of the Royal Institute of Painters
 in water colors, and illustrated Lal-
 la Rookh, Alice in Wonderland and
 many other books.
