> Coun. Melville asked if it was necessary to send a man to St. John to serve Scott Act papers—as was done in Ready Breweries case.

Secty-Treas. Not necessary papers can be sent to constable there to serve. Coun. Burtt asked if vouchers were given for bills.

Coun. Tracey said there had.

Coun. Perry moved; sec. Coun. Moxon, that the Police Magistrate and Scott Act Inspector pay the amount in their hands to the Secty-Treas. to be paid out as directed by the Council.

Coun. Stevens-We have a deficit of \$948.97 and now we move that we dispose of a surplus-it is rather confusing

Coun. Perry- By time you pay the Inspector, Mr. Jones and Mr. Holyoke's salaries you will have the deficit. The money should be paid into the Secretary's hands and then we will have some record.

Secty-Treas-There is no reason why any Scott Act money should be retained by the Inspector or Police Magistrate.

3.00 Coun. Melville moved, sec. Coun. And erson, that all Scott Act. monies in the hands of police magistrate and inspector be paid in future to Secty-Treas. Carried

Coun. Moxon moved, sec. Coun. Gallagher (Kent), that Constable Armstrong be paid \$2.00 per day for attendance at Council.

Coun. Perry moved, sec. by Coun. Burtt, that any surplus in the hands of Secty-Treas for Scott Act purposes be given Inspector when called for. Carried

Coun. Stevens-Ir more money is needed than in hands of Secty. some provisions should be made to supply it, and avoid an extra session of Council. 2.40

Coun. Tracy moved, sec. by Coun. Gallagher (Kent), that Secty-Treas. be authorized to advance \$200 to the Scott Act Inspector to carry out Act. This amount being outside the Scott Act surplus. Carried.

Coun. Melville said it seemed to be an injustice to bring jurors here to attend juries at \$1.00 a day, sometimes for a week, and he moved the following resolution, seconded by Coun. Hunter.

Whereas the fees for Petit Jurors were fixed many years ago when their expenses were not nearly as great as at present.

And whereas the Sheriff's of the different Counties in the Province now have great difficulty in getting jurors to attend the courts.

And wheres Grand Jurors have never been paid for their attentance at the several Courts.

Therefore resolved that this Council is of the opinion these that fees should be increased in all fairness and justice so that said jurors both Grand and Petit, may receive at least sufficient to pay the act-ual outlay they are called upon to

Further resolved that a copy of this resolution be given to the Premier of this Province with a request that the Provincial Government take the matter up and do justice in the matter,

And further resolved that the Secty-Treas. of the Municipality be instructed to explain to the Premier the reasons actuating the action of this council if such becomes necessary.

Coun. Bell called attention to time of election of councillors which read second Tuesday in October. He would move that Bye-law No. 27, be changed to read fourth Tuesday in October. Seconded by Coun. Flemming.

Coun. Moxon thought two weeks ear lier would be better.
