## HOUSEHOLD

**Rhubarb Sauce**

Wash and wipe, but do not peel. Cut in inch pieces—which is most easily done by laying several strips together on a stout piece of paper or a board and cutting through them with a sharp knife at one stroke. Measure the rhubarb and allow 1-3 to 1-2 a cup of sugar for each cup of rhubarb. Put in a kettle and cook over boiling water until soft and can be easily pierced with a smooth wooden toothpick. (A box of toothpicks should be kept at hand to use for all such purposes.) When cooked in this way, it is a beautiful pink sauce, with each piece whole, and little resembles the unpleasant green mass which is so often served as rhubarb sauce. Another way of preparing the sauce: Prepare according to the above recipe, but cook it in an earthenware pudding dish in the oven; keep dish covered while baking. When cooking it either way, do not add water, for as it begins to cook plenty of juice will flow from the rhubarb and unite with the sugar and make a rich syrup.

Rhubarb can also be used to make a very delicious pudding.

**Rhubarb Pudding.**

Mix together 2 cups of flour, 4 teaspoons of baking powder, 1-2 cup of sugar and 1-2 teaspoon of salt. Beat an egg light; add 2 tablespoons of melted butter and 3-4 cup of milk. Combine the two mixtures and beat well. In a baking dish have 2 cups of rhubarb cut in small pieces and 1 cup of sugar and 1-4 teaspoon of cinnamon. Spread the flour mixture over the rhubarb and bake half an hour in a moderately hot oven or steam one hour. Serve with the following sauce:

**Egg Sauce.**

Beat together 1 egg and 1 cup of sugar until light and creamy; add 1-2 cup of hot milk; flavor with 1-2 teaspoon of lemon extract.

**Fishcakes Made From Canned Salmon.**

One can of salmon, 1 pint of mashed potato, 1 egg, 2 tablespoons of milk; drain the salmon and remove the skin and bones; mash with a fork. If cold mashed potato is used, heat it over the fire with the milk. Add the fish to the potato and stir over hot water until thoroughly mixed; if too dry, add a little extra milk. Season to taste. Remove from the fire and add the egg, beaten light, and the butter. Form in shape in a mixing spoon and fry in deep fat. Drain on soft paper.

**Pickled Salmon.**

Boil 2 pounds of salmon. Remove the bones and skin. Boil together 1 cup of vinegar, 1 cup of water that the fish was boiled in, 1 dozen peppercorns, 8 whole allspice, 1 teaspoon of salt and 2 bay leaves. Boil ten minutes, then pour over the fish. In twelve hours it will be ready to serve. It is good to serve either as a relish for lunch or as a salad.

**Company Will Do  
Its Own Driving.**

The St. John River Log Driving Company have decided to continue their policy of last year by doing the driving on the lower corporation of the St. John River.

At a meeting of the company held in St. John yesterday the company reached this decision.

Coun. Gordon C. Grant, of Meductic will again be in charge of the drive, with practically the same staff as last year. Mr. John A. Morrison, Mr. J. M. Scott and Secretary-Treasurer A. V. Rowan, of this city, were in St. John yesterday to attend the meeting.

The drive this year amounting to 54,000,000 feet, would not be half enough to supply the mills on the lower river if they run full time, but the St. John mills carried over large quantities from 1913. The lumbermen are expecting a big freshet this year, the cold and backward weather having prevented the melting of the snow. Should there be an extremely large freshet, the lumbermen may lose a large quantity of lumber which might be carried away in the first rush.

The bandits, Foucault and Bourret, wanted for the murder of Constable Bourdon, in Montreal, some weeks ago, were sent to Ottawa or Hull in crates on Friday or Saturday. They were at once buried to a house, where they are now in hiding. Detective Riopelle and a squad of sleuths from headquarters are hot on their trail.

Eastport Me., April 16.—The sardine canning season on the Maine coast opened Wednesday but not one factory in this city or section received fish and telephone messages sent all along the eastern coast failed to locate any herring. None have been seen by veteran weir owners and boatmen so far this year and indications are unfavorable for any catches this month.

**Big Celebration**

For Shakespeare.

New York, April 17.—The three hundred and fiftieth anniversary of the birth of Shakespeare was celebrated last night by the American Playgoers' Club. The educational players presented several scenes from Shakespeare's plays. At the business session a committee was named to represent the club at the civic celebration of the anniversary of Shakespeare's birth.

Many clergymen announced today that they will recognize the celebration by making Shakespeare the subject of sermons on Sunday.

On Thursday of next week 300 school children will participate in the exercises at the Shakespeare statue in Central Park.

**Even School Girls Are Being Arrested.**

ST. PETERSBURG, April 17.—More than 100 arrests have been made by political police of Kiev, who have been making night raids on many private dwellings, in one of which they seized a printing press and 3,000 copies of revolutionary proclamation. Those arrested include many members of learned professions, students, high school girls, traders and artisans.

Winnipeg is discussing a "Catholic banquet" at which the toast of the King was placed after the toast of the Pope. The Lieut. Governor refused to attend. As a result of numerous protests, "God Save the King," was sung at the opening of the banquet, the toast to the Pope followed, and the toast to the King was omitted.
