If you get too much bluing in

household ammonia.

MILK STERILIZED BY ELECTRICITY.
(Women's Journal.)

Milk sterilized by electricity is sup-
plied from the official city milk depots
of Liverpool to about 1,000 babies
daily. A current of electricity of high
voltage is passed through the milk,
and it is said that the milk tastes the
same as when it leaves the cow. Strict
tests show that any tubercular or other
contamination is removed.

The babies are visited by women in-
spectors, who report the results to
headquarters. During the last ten
years many thousands of infants have
been fed from Liverpool's milk depot.

Women have the municipal suffrage
in Liverpool, and Miss Eleanor Rath-
bone, a member of the municipal coun-
cil, has been such a success in that
office that no one could be found to run
against her at the last election.

Paris comes to the front with a
new improvement in telephonic
service by the establishment of
what is termed "Service Raffels"
under which by the payment of
\$6 additional per year subscribers
may have noted all calls which
were unanswered by them. The
Central makes a note of such calls
and on the return of the subscriber
to his office or residence the list of
numbers by which he was called in
his absence are given him or a
message left will be read to him,
the extra charge for the latter
service being fixed at four cents.

A torpedo boat Thursday cu-
down a small passenger steamer
which plies between Venice and
Lido, and fifty persons were
drowned. The victims included
many women and children.

NO CLAIMANTS FOR
HUGE SUMS IN BANKS.

Ottawa, March 16.—A blue
book tabled in the House of Com-
mons on Monday, giving a list of
unclaimed bank balances in Can-
adian banks at the end of 1912,
shows that over \$750,000 is lying
to the credit of various persons
who have apparently forgotten all
about it. The total amount is larger
by \$120,000 than at the end of
1911.

**Worst Snow Storm Of
Year At Ft. William**

Fort William, Ont., March 25.—
The worst snow storm of the year
has been raging at the head of
the lakes since midnight, and gives
little promise of abating before
nightfall. Only occasional street
cars ran during the day, with the
result that hundreds who work in
the city and live in other quarters
are unable to get to work. It is
impossible for even horse drawn
vehicles to get through some
streets.
