Kneading Cloth.

A kneading cloth is more convenient than a board, writes a contributor. One can easily make one of three fourths of a yard of heavy white duck or drilling. Hem the edges and then sift on right side about a quart of flour, rubbing in well. Then it is ready for use for pastry, biscuit, cookies or doughnuts, after spreading it on table or shelf. The dough will not stick and if care is taken not to spill liquids upon it, it need not be washed frequently. After using it should be folded, flour inside and placed in a box.

Fruit Punch.

A delicious summer beverage composed mostly of fruit juices for a luncheon or reception is made after the following directions. Squeeze the juice of six lemons, of a dozen oranges and of one large pineapple in a punch bowl; sweeten palatably, but not too sweet, with fine sugar, add a quart of carbonated water and stir the whole briskly till the sugar is dissolved; put a large lump of ice in the bowl; slice one lemon, one orange and a banana very thin and put them in the bowl; also a few strawberries, and the beverage is ready to serve.

Raspberry Cordial.—Place two quarts of fresh, ripe berries in a stone crock, and pour over them one quart of cider vinegar. Tie a cloth over the crock and let stand two days. Strain through a cloth and pour the juice over two quarts of fresh berries, let stand two days as before, and then strain again, squeezing out all the juice. To every pint of the juice add one pound of white sugar, boil ten minutes; skim, and when cold, bottle and cork tightly. Keep in a cool place, and serve by adding one tablespoonful to a glassful of iced water. Blackberries may be used in the same manner.

Rhubarb Marmalade.

One and one-half pounds of rhubarb, one pound of sugar, half an ounce of bitter almonds blanched and cut in halves, one lemon cut into small pieces. Boil well together until quite thick. This is delicious and will keep any length of time.

CURRENT JAM.

Wash, steam and mash the fruit. Allow the proportion of one pound of sugar to one pound of fruit. Put the fruit and one quarter of the sugar into a granite kettle. When boiling, add another quarter of the sugar and so on. When all is used, let it boil till very thick. Putting in only a little sugar at a time prevents the fruit from becoming hard.

Peppermint Taffy.

Wet two heaping cupfuls of granulated sugar with a half pint of cold water and put over the fire in a porcelain-lined saucepan. When the sugar is dissolved, stir in a bit of cream of tartar as large as a lima bean dissolved in a spoonful of cold water. Boil the candy until a bit hardens when dropped into cold water. Remove from the fire, stir in a teaspoonful extract of peppermint, turn into greased pans, mark into squares and set aside to harden. Or, as the candy cools, pull it with buttered finger tips into long white ropes. Let it get very cold and brittle before eating.

Very excellent orange extract is made by putting grated orange peel in to a bottle half full of pure alcohol. Allow it to stand for three weeks, then strain.

To keep lemons, put them in a stone jar of clean, dry sand, so that they do not touch.

Good lard is much better than butter for basting roasted meat and for frying.
