HOUSEHOLD

GRAPE BUTTER.

To each quart of grapes use 1 pint of
sugar. Make as much as desired, as it
will keep all month.

Wash and pulp the grapes; put the
pulp over fire in porcelain-lined kettle
and boil five minutes; mash and strain
through wire strainer; add the skins
and boil slowly twenty minutes, then
add the sugar. To each cup of grapes
add 1-2 cup of sugar and boil twenty to
twenty-five minutes longer, stirring of-
ten. Some grapeskins are more tender
than others; it may take longer to cook
tender. The grape butter must be
thick and not separate.

**APPLES STUFFED WITH
FIGS.**

Pare and core large apples, fill
centres with chopped figs, cover
with sugar, place in a deep bak-
ing dish and add a little water;
bake, basting well frequently.
Serve with whipped cream.

CHICKEN ALABAMA.

This is a good way to serve a
fowl too tough for broiling or
roasting. Draw the chicken and
truss as for roasting. Put it in-
to the boiler or steamer, with
enough boiling water to make
one and a half pints when chick-
en is tender. Put the neck, the
feet, cleaned, skinned and crack-
ed tips of wings and gizzard in
the water to make stock. When
the fowl is tender, take it out of
the steamer and put it down in-
to the broth or liquor underneath
seasoning this to taste with salt
and pepper. Let it stand in the
broth to absorb the juice and
flavor until ready to prepare for
dinner. It should stand all day
or all night. Cut it up in pieces
for frying. Put in a shallow dish
half a cup of flour, seasoned
with salt and pepper. Roll the
pieces of chicken in this and fry
a nice brown in good pork dripp-
ings or vegetable oil. Make a
cream sauce or gravy, using the
chicken stock and a few table-
spoonfuls of good cream.
When the chicken is arranged
on a hot platter pour some of the
gravy over it and serve piping
hot, with more gravy, in a sauce-
boat.

Canada is Being Given Preference

London, Oct. 6.—Cables re-
ceived from Canada show that
there is an impression abroad
there that naval and military
authorities here are placing ex-
tensive orders in the United States
for their requirements. In-
quiries show that this impression
is perfectly unwarranted.

The acting High Commissioner
has had interviews with Colonial
Secretary Harcourt and others
on the subject, and finds the
authorities most anxious that
supplies from Canada should be
utilized to the fullest extent.

The mistaken impression is
perhaps due to the fact that cer-
tain sub-contractors are fulfilling
their obligations with American
assistance, but even if this is so
there is no direct evidence of it.

Care of the Ewe and Lamb

The Live Stock Branch of the Depart-
ment of Agriculture at Ottawa has is-
sued a very practical bulletin on "The
care of the Ewe and Lamb." It consti-
tutes a shepherd's presentation of the
details of management of the breeding
flock, more particularly during the win-
ter and spring months. It takes up,
among other things, parturition, feed-
ing, docking, castration, the raising of
pet lambs, and the simple and more
serious ailments and accidents met with
in the ordinary flock, concluding with
a series of paragraphs termed "Leaves
from the note-book of a successful
Shepherd."

The bulletin, which is helpfully ill-
ustrated was prepared by T. Reginald
Arkell, who has charge of the Sheep
and Goat Division of the Live Stock
Branch. It is designated as Pamphlet
No. 5 of the Live Stock Branch. Copies
are available to those who apply for
them to the Publications Branch, De-
partment of Agriculture, Ottawa.

**German Companies
Average 95 Men.**

Paris—The Temps has received the
following letter, written in pencil, from
the front:

"I have been running across fields
from one destroyed village to another in
the midst of the odor of corpses which
persists, owing to the fact that the
graves of those killed in battle were
not dug sufficiently deep.

"Yesterday we took three village
with the bayonet.

"The German companies now aver-
age only 95, notwithstanding the re-
inforcements which they have received.
They are dying of hunger. Twenty
bombs fall on them daily. On an aver-
age four persons are killed by each
bomb. Where our 75 millimeter shells
are well placed they are estimated to
account for thirty dead per shell.

"All the wine in Champagne has been
drunk, and we are now reduced to tea.
I sleep here and there, wherever I am,
and would find it disagreeable to sleep
in bed. We eat well and the food is ex-
cellent. We are all in the best of spirits.
