establishment of a farm. In no case had counties which had established farm gone back to the old system.

Coun Melville would like to see the estimate of the cost as a business proposition; he moved that the committee go on with inquiries particularly as to cost and report at the January session.

Coun Estey seconded the motion. Coun Britton said he could give estimates of the cost of a farm now.

Coun Flemming—We are dealing with a report of the committee.

Coun Lamont—I would like to get some more information; there would be a good deal of detail and I figure it would cost us about \$20,000 to start with; he would favor the committee securing further information.

Coun Stevens moved that the report of the committee be received. Coun Lamont seconded the motion.

Coun A. G. Bell wanted to know what that meant.

The warden—The report does not make specific any recommendation. The report was received.

Coun Britton—We have an offer of a farm for \$4,000 and one for \$2,800. Concluded next week.
