Boiled Salad Dressing.

Materials-Mustard, 1 teaspoon. salt, 2 teaspoons; pepper, 1.8 teaspoon; sugar, 2 tablespoons; cornstarch, 1 tablespoon; eggs, 2; butter, 2 tablespoons; milk, 1 cup; vinegar, 1-3 cup.

Utensils-Double boiler, bowl, egg_ beater, tablespoon, teaspoon, cup.

Directions-Mix dry ingredients in top of double boiler; add milk and butter, cook over hot water until thick; pour on beaten eggs, return mixture o double boiler and cook slowly un- Now Going at til thick; while the eggs are cooking add hot vinegar slowly. Remove from fire as soon as thick and pour into bowl. If it should curdle, beat with egg beat-

CHOCOLATE PUDDING.

Materials-Butter, I-4 cup; sugar, 1 cup; yolks 2 eggs; milk, 1-2 cup, flour, 1 3-8 cups, baking powder, 3 teaspoons; salt, 1-4 teaspoon; vanilla, 1-4 teaspoon whites 2 eggs; chocolate, 1 1-3 squares. Utensils-Bowls, 2; spoon, knife, eggbeater, cups, 2.

Directions-Cream butter, add half the sugar gradually. Beat egg yolks thick, add remainder of sugar; combine mixtures, and add milk alternately with flour mixed with baking powder and salt; add whites, melted chocolate and vanilla. Bake in angel cake tin. Cool. Fill center with whip ped cream, sweetened and flavored; pour around chocolate sauce.

CHOCOLATE SAUCE.

Materials-Sugar, 1 cup; water, 1-2 cup; cream of tartar, 4 grains; chocolate, 11-2 squares; vanilla, 1-4 teaspoon.

Utensils-Saucepan, 2; tablespoon. Directions-Melt chocolate, hoil sugar, water, cream of tartar until consistency of thin syrup; pour on chocolate gradually; cool slightly and flavor with vanilla.

Miss Jean Peacock who was the instructor in Domestic Science in the Summer School of Rural Science just closed, has kindly given these receipts to "The Dispath."

There is one department of the Summer School of Rural Science just closed in which every one of us has an interest viz., that department which teaches how to make nice things to eat. Lessons in the making of soups, salads, sandwiches and desserts as well as instruction and practice in canning fruit and cooking meats and fish have been carried on up there during the last few weeks. We were especially interested in the puddings which the girls were taught to make. We were able to secure the recipes given below and we are sure if you make them carefully you will become a devotee of Domestic' Science methods.

ORANGE PUFFS.

- 1-3 cup butter 1 cup sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1.2 cup milk
- 13-4 cup flour
- 3 teaspoons baking powder

Cream the butter, add the sugar then the beaten eggs, then milk and sifted dry ingredients alternately. Bake in muffin pans in a moderate oven 25 minutes-

ORANGE SAUCE.

Whites 3 eggs 1 cup fine granulated sugar Grated rind 2 oranges Juice of 2 oranges

Add orange rind and fruit juice.

3 tablespoons lemon juice Beat whites of eggs until stiff, add sugar gradually, beating all the time.

Note- If desired the yorks of three eggs can be used in the pudding leaving the whites for the sauce.)

CARAMEL PUDDING.

- 1 cup brown sugar
- 1-4 cup boiling water 1 1-2 cup scalded milk
- 4 tablespoons cornstarch
- 18 teaspoon salt 1-2 cup cold milk
- 1 egg 1.2 teaspoon vanilla
