HOUSEHOLD

Boiled Salad Dressing.

Materials—Mustard, 1 teaspoon. salt,
2 teaspoons; pepper, 1-8 teaspoon;
sugar, 2 tablespoons; cornstarch, 1
tablespoon; eggs, 2; butter, 2 table-
spoons; milk, 1 cup; vinegar, 1-3 cup.Utensils—Double boiler, bowl, egg
beater, tablespoon, teaspoon, cup.Directions—Mix dry ingredients in
top of double boiler; add milk and
butter, cook over hot water until thick;
pour on beaten eggs, return mixture
to double boiler and cook slowly un-
til thick; while the eggs are cooking
add hot vinegar slowly. Remove from
fire as soon as thick and pour into bowl.
If it should curdle, beat with egg beat-
er.

CHOCOLATE PUDDING.

Materials—Butter, 1-4 cup; sugar, 1
cup; yolks 2 eggs; milk, 1-2 cup, flour,
1-3-8 cups, baking powder, 3 teaspoons;
salt, 1-4 teaspoon; vanilla, 1-4 teaspoon
whites 2 eggs; chocolate, 1 1-3 squares.Utensils—Bowls, 2; spoon, knife,
eggbeater, cups, 2.Directions—Cream butter, add half
the sugar gradually. Beat egg yolks
thick, add remainder of sugar; com-
bine mixtures, and add milk alter-
nately with flour mixed with baking
powder and salt; add whites, melted
chocolate and vanilla. Bake in angel
cake tin. Cool. Fill center with whip-
ped cream, sweetened and flavored;
pour around chocolate sauce.

CHOCOLATE SAUCE.

Materials—Sugar, 1 cup; water, 1-2
cup; cream of tartar, 4 grains; choco-
late, 1 1-2 squares; vanilla, 1-4 teaspoon.

Utensils—Saucepan, 2; tablespoon.

Directions—Melt chocolate, boil
sugar, water, cream of tartar until
consistency of thin syrup; pour on choco-
late gradually; cool slightly and flavor
with vanilla.

Receipts.

Miss Jean Peacock who was
the instructor in Domestic Sci-
ence in the Summer School of
Rural Science just closed, has
kindly given these receipts to
"The Dispatch."There is one department of the Sum-
mer School of Rural Science just closed
in which every one of us has an interest
viz., that department which teaches
how to make nice things to eat. Les-
sons in the making of soups, salads,
sandwiches and desserts as well as in-
struction and practice in canning fruit
and cooking meats and fish have been
carried on up there during the last few
weeks. We were especially interested
in the puddings which the girls were
taught to make. We were able to
secure the recipes given below and we
are sure if you make them carefully
you will become a devotee of Domestic
Science methods.

ORANGE PUFFS.

1-3 cup butter
1 cup sugar
2 eggs
1-2 cup milk
1-3-4 cup flour
3 teaspoons baking powderCream the butter, add the sugar then
the beaten eggs, then milk and sifted
dry ingredients alternately. Bake in
muffin pans in a moderate oven 25 min-
utes.

ORANGE SAUCE.

Whites 3 eggs
1 cup fine granulated sugar
Grated rind 2 oranges
Juice of 2 oranges
3 tablespoons lemon juiceBeat whites of eggs until stiff, add
sugar gradually, beating all the time.
Add orange rind and fruit juice.Note—If desired the yolks of three
eggs can be used in the pudding leaving
the whites for the sauce.)

CARAMEL PUDDING.

1 cup brown sugar
1-4 cup boiling water
1 1-2 cup scalded milk
4 tablespoons cornstarch
1 8 teaspoon salt
1-2 cup cold milk
1 egg
1-2 teaspoon vanillaMelt dry sugar to a caramel in a fry-
ing pan, add carefully the boiling water.
If lumpy add a little more water and
allow to boil. Mix cornstarch, salt and
cold milk and add to hot milk. Cook
in a double boiler, stirring until it
thickens, then add caramel. Cook 45
minutes stirring every ten minutes.

InterruptedMontreal, July 30.—The service to
this port of vessels in the so called Can-
ada lines is liable to be interrupted at
any moment, as it is understood they
will cancel sailings the moment war is
declared.First Sailing of an Ocean-Go-
ing VesselPanama, July 30.—Colonel Geo. W.
Goethals, governor of the Panama
Canal Zone, announced today that the
first sailing through the canal of an
ocean-going vessel, would take place
next Monday, when the steamer Crio-
tobel would make the trip from Colon
to Balbro. This trip will be made in
order to test the lock operations and
the handling of large vessels at turns
in the canal, and at places where there
are strong currents.Col. Goethals stated that the official
opening of the canal to world traffic,
by order of the Secretary of War Gar-
rison, would occur August 15, when
the steamer Ancon will make the first
official trip from deep water of the At-
lantic to the deep water in the Pacific.'Nevertheless, I cannot begrudge
